

USE OF FLAG IS RESENTED

BERNE, Switzerland, (AP)—Shops to boycott all European merchants who have resorted to the American national colors for advertising purposes have been taken this summer by American tourists who have been shocked at the extensive use made of the Stars and Stripes to draw attention to numerous kinds of wares of various countries.

It has been pointed out by tourists that there is already a flag on the continent which has been frequented by Americans where the combination of red, white, and blue in one form or another has not been used as an advertising medium, and the word has been passed around by travelers to give such stores and shops a wide berth wherever possible.

Tourists have reported that in a few instances where the attention of dealers was called to the improper use being made of the American flag for advertising, the practice was given up at once. On the other hand, however, other patriotic Americans say that their protests were ignored altogether by merchants and the colors remained in the display windows, or over the shop doors or in some other position where they had been placed to draw attention.

Travelers who have made investigations in several countries say that there are no laws covering the use of the American national colors for advertising purposes and that on this account American consular officials are powerless to take any action.

In one of the principal streets of Moscow the Stars and Stripes were painted over a shoe repairing shop during the regime of Czar Nicholas II and the colors, dulled by age and weathered scars of the Russian revolution, are noticeable to passers-by even to this day. Persons who understand English are able to read the time-worn lettering which says "American shoe repairing done here," printed over the American colors but the old shoemaker himself passed out with the revolution.

Portland to Honor French.

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP)—The statue of Joan of Arc by Premier ordered last January by Dr. Henry Waldo Coe, of this city, to be placed in a park here as a tribute to the French pioneers who helped settle Oregon, has been completed. The statue is a full-sized reproduction of the Premier statue at the Place des Pyramides in Paris, and, like the original, is finished in gold leaf.

DEFENSE DAY IS FAVORED

PORTLAND, Ore. (Special)—National Defense day will be observed at Hill Military academy, September 12, according to the announcement of Joseph A. Hill, principal, who spoke at the assembly on the subject.

"We believe in peace. We do not want war," said Mr. Hill, "but we believe that we should take stock of our forces of defense and by doing so let some of our neighbors see that we are a determined, united and patriotic people. We don't want war, I repeat, and we believe that an outward showing of our strength will help to keep some of our neighbor nations quiet and peaceful. Our school teaches loyalty to the flag, discipline or character and moral training as well as the strictly academic and military work and we believe that if boys are kept busy and are encouraged to occupy their lives in constructive work, in activities that assure healthful bodies, well disciplined and wholesome characters, that the nation will have a splendid foundation for defense. But to impress the mind of the holder there must be an outward and visible demonstration of discipline and of the readiness of our nation to protect its rights. Its honor, its honor. Such a demonstration must inspire respect and admiration and awaken our minds to an appreciation of the glories of peace, peace that is backed up with strength, patriotism a united devotion to the ideas for which the Stars and Stripes stand."

Sixteen Labor Conventions Created by Geneva Bureau

GENEVA, (AP)—Before the World War and as a result of generations of effort, only two international labor conventions had been adopted, but since the war 14 international instruments have been elaborated through the machinery of the International labor office of the League of Nations. The two pre-war conventions covered the questions of night work for women and the use of white phosphorus in the manufacture of matches. Recent weeks have shown a marked increase in the number of ratifications of conventions adopted by the various post-war international labor conferences, the total now being 120.

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FIRE HYDRANTS ARE INSTALLED AT UNIVERSITY

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Ore. (Special)—New fire hydrants, new fire escapes, and a roof sprinkling system constitute the major part of the equipment for fire protection installed on the University campus during the past few months. The removal of fire risks and the addition of new equipment has been an important part of the work done by the department of buildings and grounds, under the supervision of H. M. Fisher, superintendent, this summer.

Two of the new hydrants were furnished by the city of Eugene and three by the University. Nine hundred feet of eight inch pipe and 300 feet of six inch pipe were used in connecting the hydrants with the city water supply. Six new fire escapes have been placed on the University buildings, and those on the halls of residence are now standardized.

The Womans building, in which the valuable Murray Warner collection of Oriental art is housed is afforded additional protection by the installation of a roof sprinkling system. The wiring in the library, McClure hall, and Friendly hall has all been put in conduit, and there is now no open wiring on the campus.

The fire fighting equipment of the University includes fire hose on each floor of every building, and about 200 chemical extinguishers placed conveniently about the buildings. Water from the mill race, which is pumped to the campus for sprinkling the lawn, can be used effectively against fire.

Ireland Gives Subsidies for Every Acre Planted to Trees

DUBLIN, (AP)—Last year the Free State government planted 4,000,000 trees on 10,000 acres of land and proposes this year to plant 1,000 acres.

The minister of agriculture described Ireland as perhaps the worst wooded country in the world. The establishment of peasant proprietary has helped to deforest the country. It was said in the fact that the first thing a farmer did on getting his land was to cut down the timber.

The government is inviting the county committees of agriculture to set aside a certain sum for forestry and will make a grant of \$100 for every acre used for growing trees.

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LIFE LENGTH IS DEPENDENT

TORONTO, Ont. (AP)—The average length of life, and success in reproduction and lactation, depend on the existence in the body of a sufficient amount of the vitamin known to science under the name of fat-soluble A. This was announced by Prof. H. C. Sherman of Columbia University at a joint symposium on vitamins held by the Chemistry and Physiology sections of the British Association for the Advancement of Science.

For ten years it has been known that this constituent of butter and cream is essential to growth and the prevention of eye disease, but its importance for other functions, such as lactation, had been recognized. The vitamin has been named fat-soluble A because it is dissolved by the solutions which dissolve fats.

Diets in which it is present in relatively small amounts fail utterly to support successful reproduction and lactation, though the individual may be enjoying apparent good health. It is believed, also, that susceptibility to lung disease is due in part at least to the absence from the diet of sufficient quantities of fat-soluble A.

Professor Sherman pointed out that deficiencies of this vitamin in what are considered normal diets cannot be taken for granted. Numerous variations may occur in the plant tissues from which the foods, and in turn the human beings, obtain their store of this important substance. Measures must be taken to ensure its presence in amounts which provide an adequate sufficiency, the speaker declared.

WOMAN ATTEMPTS SUICIDE

LOS ANGELES, (AP)—Mrs. Charlotte Lee, Hollywood widow, who last Thursday filed suit for \$50,000 against Police Chief August Vollmer of Los Angeles, alleging breach of promise to marry and seduction, was treated at the receiving hospital here Sunday after what police surgeons said was an attempt to commit suicide by taking poison and inhaling gas. She will recover.

German Girl Holds Own Hair Then Blames Human Monster

ROSENTHAL, Germany (AP)—The police have recently completed a long investigation of a reported attack upon Charlotte Fensler, a young stenographer, by a human monster, who cut off her braids and was prevented from doing further harm by the appearance of the girl's dog, according to Charlotte.

The police, pressing Charlotte closely for the facts learned that the girl wanted to have her hair bobbed and was forbidden by her parents; that Charlotte held up herself and cut off her own braids and then reported the alleged attack to the police.

Nature Makes "Dry" Rain.

ANCHORAGE, Alaska, (AP)—Within a week nature accomplished what a corps of deputy marshals and dragoons failed to do in many months. Two great forest fires started by moonshine stills practically annihilated the Indians in the region. Forest rangers report that they have some across a dozen stills destroyed by the flames. In some instances the owners barely escaped with their lives.

FORD PUSHED BY R. HARROP

DETROIT. (By the Associated Press)—Roy M. Harrop, vice-presidential nominee of the People's Progressive party, announced here Sunday that he would demand that the name of Henry Ford be placed on the ballot in Nebraska as a presidential candidate of the Progressive party. He declared he would protect against the placing of Senator La Follette's name on the ballot as the party's presidential candidate and would also object to the certification of Dan Butler as the Progressive party's candidate for governor.

Mr. Harrop declared Henry Ford had received the presidential endorsement in the Nebraska primaries. His objection to Senator La Follette, he said, was based on the senator's stand against the K. K. "Senator La Follette," he said, "has ruined a religious question in his mind. He is the K. K., which I do not believe is brought in good faith."

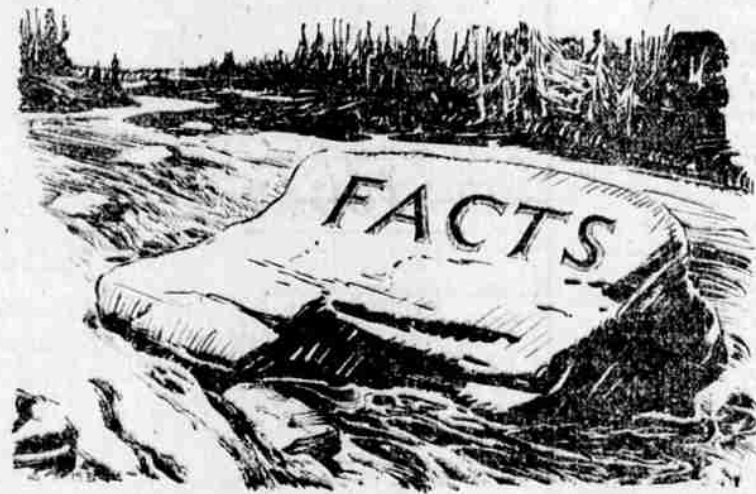
