Cruze Scores Again In "To the Ladies," At the Star Soon.
 Something that has never happened in Los Angeles before in the history of the motion picture industry and probably will not soon again, recently occurred here. A motion picture director had three first run pictures running in three first run houses at one time. Jimmy Cruze is the director. And the pictures were "The Covered Wagon"—at Grandman's Hollywood, "Lunges of Red Gap" at Gramman's Metropolitan, and "Hollywood"—at Loew's State.
 Which brings to mind a few remarks that might be made upon James Cruze, director. He is a young man who is turning out great pictures. He is making the best time and again, not only with the box office but with the critics. Yet he is the most businesslike the most verbose man you ever met. He never talks about art. He doesn't take himself seriously. Generally, his pictures can be cut in a few minutes because he has shot to close what he needed that there is really nothing to do but make a selection of the best "takes" of a scene.
 There is a tradition in Hollywood that he once shot a picture that only had to be trimmed 500 feet—this when most directors who make his pictures shoot hundreds of thousands of feet. Chapman claims to have shot a film shot to get 7,500 feet of picture for "The Woman of Paris."
 Jimmy Cruze has just one goal. Entertainment. He believes that the prime object of a motion picture is entertainment. He has no complex, no inhibitions, he is not trying to change the world, or the industry.
 He's making good, human, honest stories that he hopes are going to give drama and joy, and the kids a good evening of enjoyment, clean wholesome enjoyment, that will make them forget their cares and troubles. Maybe he's right.
 "To the Ladies," Mr. Cruze's latest work for Paramount, featuring Edward Horton, Theodore Roberts, Helen Jerome Eddy and Louise Dresser, comes to the Star Theatre for a two days' run starting Wednesday. It's a superb comedy drama.

"Girl Shy" Proves Versatility of Harold Lloyd.
 Variety is the spice of life, and it is also the secret of success in making good motion pictures. Many stars fall into a rut because they insist upon making the same line of pictures and using the same kind of characterizations. They never change because they
