than four courses, two of nine holes and two of 18.

There are 52 public tennis courts and 17 baseball diamonds.

And, in addition to the public playing beach in the tidal basin, there is, near the Washington monument, a juvenile swimming pool.

According to the records, golf is the most popular sport in the capital, 277,477 players having checked in on the public links last year. Swimming comes second, with 175,120, and tennis third with 55,999.

Cricket—we almost forgot the proper courts—provided the thrills for 5252 of the less strenuously inclined.

The next extension of the public play program of the capital may be the inauguration of public riding stables, to provide mounts for folks who would like to ramble on horseback along the District's bridle paths.

There are already more than 50 miles of these bridle paths, but to date they have been "exclusive." Only folks who own their own mounts, or who can afford the high charges assumed by private riding academies, have been able to enjoy them.

Col. C. O. Sherrill, in charge of public grounds, now recommends that cavalry horses, unpermitted to stock a stable near one of the parks, from which they can be rented at a nominal sum to the public.

If that is done, the "exclusive" recreation of the capital will have been made common property.

Grain Shipments Heavy in July. WALLA WALLA, Wash.—Approximately 500 cars of grain were shipped from valley points during July, according to estimates of growers. The 1924 crop is estimated at between 3,500,000 and 4,000,000 bushels for Walla Walla county.

To date, about 550 cars of onions have been shipped, with growers receiving from \$1.50 to \$2 per sack on an average. About 10 cars of prunes have been shipped. The yield for this district is estimated at 25 to 30 cars.

Shipments of vegetables, other than onions, have been comparatively light, the total running between 75 and 100 cars.

Fruit Branch to Open. HOOD RIVER, Ore.—J. A. Mead, president of the Northwestern Fruit Exchange, here from Seattle, announced that the fruit distributing concern would establish a Walla Walla office here at once and be prepared to participate in this season's apple deal. J. H. Cederwall will be in charge of the local office.

Mr. Mead said he found the apple crop of the Hood River valley more uniform than any other district, this section having suffered less from damage during April.

Railroad Junk Proves Valuable. LOS ANGELES, Cal. (AP)—The Southern Pacific Railroad company saved \$2,531,875.72 last year by accumulating and reclaiming materials which otherwise might be classed as junk, according to a report. Reclamation of material netted a saving of \$412,952.32 on the sale or use by the company of scrap amounted to \$1,918,923.40.

OLYMPIA, Wash.—Henry C. Hill of Bremerton, acting as the agent of A. E. Lichtenstein, New York stamp collector, has just negotiated the purchase of two 12-cent Canadian stamps at a total of \$4,000. It was stated here by J. M. Hill, state librarian and father of Henry Hill.

The stamps are of the first Canadian issue and are attached, having been taken from the lower left-hand corner of the sheet, and show the printing margin which circumstances greatly enhance the value of the stamps, Hill said. Only one other set of these stamps is in existence, he stated.
