## Leonard Asked to Meet Walker in Title Match

NEW YORK, (AP)—Denny Leonard, lightweight champion, who has been asked by the New York state athletic commission to agree to box Dave Shade of California in a title match on or before January 1, 1925, in the event he defeat Mickey Walker, world's welterweight title holder, was expected to submit his signed agreement to the commission Wednesday. Walker already has consented to a similar arrangement and has promised to post a bond of \$10,000 to bind the bargain and to engage in none but the Leonard bout before meeting Shade.

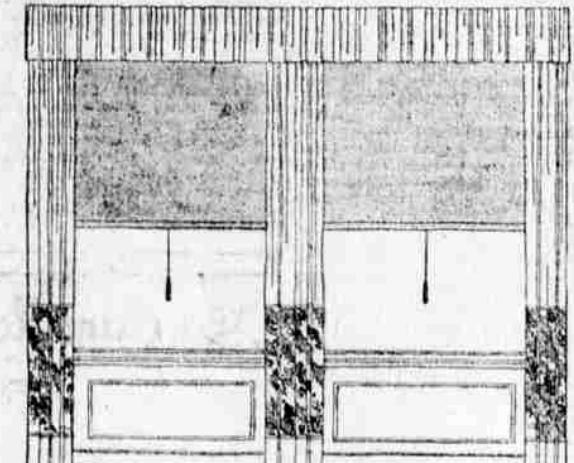
Eric Pudley, one of America's greatest polo players, and his favorite mount. He is figured to star in September match against British team, to be played before Prince of Wales.

## Hackers Heavy Losers on Gibbons-Bloomfield Bout

LONDON, (AP)—Lawyers representing Tom Gibbons, American boxer, have written Major Arnold Bloomfield, promoter of the Gibbons-Bloomfield fight last Saturday, claiming that \$661 pounds, (about \$35,500) is due their client, this being the difference in starting between \$50,000 and the 3000 pounds which Gibbons received. Major Wilson has gone to the country under physicians' orders, suffering from a nervous breakdown brought on by the strain of managing the fight. The Daily Ketch says the fight resulted in a round loss of 12,000 pounds to its backers, and the receipts amounting to 15,000 pounds against expenses of 27,000 pounds.

## LEONARD'S INJURIES ARE CONFIRMED BY DOCTORS

NEW YORK, (AP)—Examination of Benny Leonard's thumb Wednesday by physicians, including two representatives of the state athletic commission, confirmed the extent of injuries sustained by the lightweight champion in his match with Pal Moran at Cleveland and resulted in calling off his match with Mickey Walker for the welterweight title next week at the Yankee stadium. James J. Johnston, promoter, announced that another conference would be held Thursday to discuss a new date for the match. Examination disclosed that the right thumb had been dislocated at the terminal joint and several ligaments torn.

## PLAYERS NEED MORE TRAINING

CHICAGO, (AP)—Indifferent physical condition and lack of the proper spring training causes the mid-season collapse of clubs, which, at the start of the season seemed certain pennant contenders, in the belief of Stan Johnson, president of the American League. President Johnson said the present day conditioning program is all wrong and that a return to the old-time system, when players started to harden themselves physically as early as the first of the year, would result in better baseball. "In the old days players did not think of starting to play baseball in the spring until they were capable of standing it," he said. "Cy Young and many others, in the old days, went to Hot Springs and other winter resorts, and by climbing, walking and running developed their strength gradually. Then they started to play baseball and did not fall victims to 'charley horse' and other ailments. They were down to weight and as hard as nails when it came time to start the actual practice." "Today it seems to be the general practice of every player to start right in and practice baseball pitching, throwing, running, and batting with soft muscles and no wind. That is all wrong. If they started to condition themselves slowly soon after the first of the year, they would be ready for practice when the training season started, and it would result in a better game."

## Huckleberry Bushes Destroyed

PENDLETON, Or.—The practice followed by many pickers of the luscious huckleberry of breaking off branches and shaking the berries off will eventually lead to killing the bushes, according to a statement made at the local office of the forest service. Pendleton people who have spent days in the blue mountains in quest of berries report that in many patches piles of dead branches were seen.
