Carlton Griffin completes the cast in the role of a wealthy young idler.

"Grit" Now Playing at Sherrys Theater.

F. Scott Fitzgerald, who writes so cleverly about flappers and philosophers has tried his hand at a movie story, with the very best of results. In "Grit," the Hokin-ton picture now playing at the Sherry theatre, Mr. Fitzgerald has blended a corking good crook-story and an appealing romance of young love.

It is reported that Mr. Fitzgerald wrote "Grit" especially for Glenn Hunter and it surely seems that this must be so, for the part is ideally suited to Mr. Hunter's aptitude for faithfully portraying youth. The story is about "Kid Hart" son of a gangster, who is brought up by the gang to be "the best lockpicker on the East side." The "Kid" has inherited a few of guns, and Smith, leader of the gang, takes advantage of this to force the "Kid" to do his bidding. It is his love for Orchild McGonigle, who is not afraid to leave the gang and "go straight," that finally makes the "Kid" find his better self. We're not going to spoil the climax for you but we want you to know that it is a climax with real, honest-to-goodness thrills.

Glenn Hunter is as charming as he has been in all his previous pictures. He seems to be able to give a perfect picture of youth in any strata of society. His make-up "Kid Hart" of the underworld as real as he made "Sweetie" of the "upper ten" in his first picture, "The Grade Hunter." Fitzgerald has drawn both a flapper and a philosopher in Orchild McGonigle, the little East Side hoyden, and Clara Bow portrays her to perfection. Oswald Perkins as Boris Giovanni Smith, the gang leader, is an excellently made as an ideal villain should be. The supporting cast is unusually good. It includes Townsend Martin, Helenka Adamowska, Roloff Young, Dore Davidson, Martin Broder and Joseph Dewey.

A word of praise should be given to the Film Guild for the fidelity of its production. As a picture of the underworld alone, "Grit" is worth seeing. It is also worth seeing as a crackjack Fitzgerald story. Taking all of its good points together, its action
