**Germany Still Opposes Foreign Automobiles**  
BERLIN, (AP)—American automobile interests have taken keen account of a fight which developed here recently between the German Association of Automobile Dealers, which favors removal of government restrictions against cars of all kinds, and the German manufacturers who desire to keep the prohibitions effective. The import restrictions are of particular importance to all States, as they curtail the sale of American cars in Germany to a considerable extent.

According to a report to the United States Department of Commerce made by Pavle W. Alport, trade commissioner in charge of the commercial attaché bureau of the American embassy in Berlin, two major problems must be solved before the German market can possibly open its doors to the cars from the other side of the Atlantic. The first is the import prohibition and the second the problem of finance. Arrangements have already been made through three different channels to finance transactions worth about 1,000 cars a month which would be shipped to Germany. This number being considered sufficient to meet normal requirements for the time being.

It has been estimated that with the import restrictions lifted, and by paying a reasonable duty, American cars could be sold here for from 20 to 25 percent cheaper than the rates charged for automobiles.

**Car Upset, Two Killed.**  
WAUNA, Ore.—A touring car bearing a Washington license plate went over a 50-foot bank about one mile west of the Wauna road at the foot of Dugby loops and instantly killed two women who were passengers in the car. Mrs. E. E. Mergel of Elgin, Washington, and Stella G. Smythe, 2657 Thompson street, Tacoma, Wash. A boy and girl 10 or 12 years of age in the car with them are thought to be the children of Mrs. Smythe. They escaped death but were badly cut and bruised.

Coroner Hughes of Astoria was called and took the bodies in charge.
