German Radio Industry Hard Hit by Finance and Patents

BERLIN. (AP).—Another burst of high hopes in the story of Germany's radio industry. When government restrictions on the sale of receiving sets were lifted last fall a hundred or more factories sprang up. Of these, only two or three are still working, largely for exportation. The manufacturers blame the introduction of the rentenmark and the sudden end of the inflation period for the situation.

The fact that most of the patents in the field are controlled by the "Telefunken" concern may be another snag for the young industry.

AUSTRALIA WINS DAVIS CUP. PROVIDENCE, R. I. (AP).—Australia won the American zone Davis cup finals Friday when Gerard I. Patterson and Pat O'Hara Wood of Australia defeated Sumio Ohamoto and Takeshi Harada of Japan in a sensational doubles match, 7-5, 6-2, 6-4. The Australians had previously won the first two singles matches.

PUT OSBORNE IN FAME HALL

NEW YORK (AP).—By virtue of his achievements in the Olympic games Harold M. Osborne of the Illinois A. C. has won an enduring place among America's premier track and field athletes of all time. Osborne won two gold medals by his brilliant victories in the running high jump and decathlon at Paris, thereby coaching the zenith of a long and remarkable career. The one man, able from Osborne himself, to whom a lion's share of credit is due for the athlete's record is Coach Harry Gill, who has been training men at the University of Illinois for 20 years. Gill discovered and developed Osborne shortly after he arrived at the university, an obscure aspirant for honors in the world of sports. Osborne, who possesses international, National A. A. U., and Olympic trophies, won his first important title, the western conference high jump championship, only four years ago. He has suffered occasional reverses in this event since then but has remained supreme in the decathlon, his specialty. He registered his most praiseworthy achievements in this event at the Columbus stadium a few weeks ago, not only winning the Olympic title but establishing a new world mark.

VACATION DURING WINTER IN RURAL SCHOOLS IS PLAN

WINCHESTER, Ky. (AP).—A new plan whereby students in county schools are to be given a mid-winter vacation, with correspondingly shorter summer vacations, is to be inaugurated in the Clark county schools this winter. Prof. Peter Akin, superintendent of county schools, in announcing this departure from the usual period of instruction, declares that in his opinion it will materially increase attendance and insure the country student a good education. The greatest trouble in rural districts is that in winter, when snow and ice are on the ground, the student often finds it impossible to get to school. Prof. Akin said, "Under the new plan, schools will be closed during the worst winter months." Another feature pointed out was that the teachers, who ordinarily spend their vacations attending summer schools, may now take advantage of the mid-winter vacation and attend normal school then.

The Clark county schools under the new plan opened Aug. 4, and will continue in session five months, closing Dec. 15. On March 16 another school term will start and will run until June 5.
