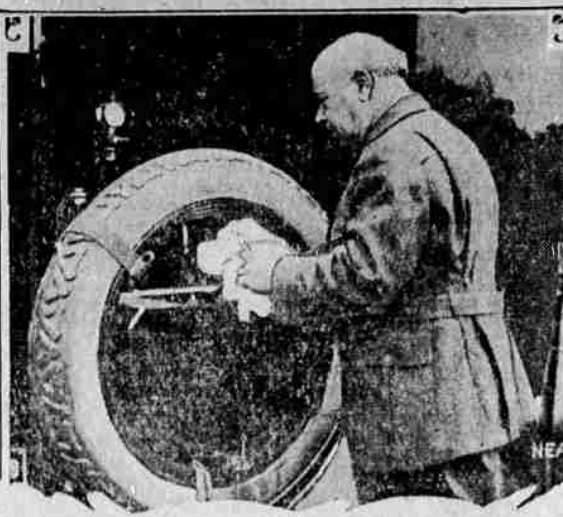

LOST SON FOUND AFTER QUARTER CENTURY ABSENCE

MANILA, (AP)—A letter from a mother in Danville, Ky., to the Manila police department has been the means of locating a long lost son. Twenty-five years ago Frank Sapp enlisted in the army and came to the Philippines where he served during the aggression. At the end of the engagement he remained here, engaging in various occupations. In her letter to the police department Mrs. Sapp wrote that her son had never written home since he enlisted in a volunteer regiment, but that she had received intelligence that he was in the Philippines in the lumber business. The coast guard steamer Pathfinder, which recently returned from an inspection trip to the Balayan Islands, brought news that Frank Sapp, an American, operated a sawmill on the island of Canguin in the Balayan group and that he had possession of a number of rifles, on which he transported about 75 natives from Balayan Island who were partly struck by the active volcano there, to Canguin Island by sea. Sapp gave equipment to the natives in his sawmill. On the next trip of the Pathfinder to the Balayan group Mrs. Sapp's mother will be sent to him. Meanwhile a letter from the police department on its way to Mrs. Sapp telling her that her son has been located.

Rome Building Houses For Jubilee Pilgrims

ROME, (AP) — The Eternal City has generally taken eternally long to make those alterations which her increasing size and growing population render necessary. Now, however, she has drawn up a program of improvements which, if half of it is carried out, will transform Rome from an old-fashioned, somewhat disorganized city, into a modern capital. These changes will be made between now and next January, the beginning of the Jubilee Year. During 1925 Rome expects between 1,000,000 and 3,000,000 pilgrims. The greatest needs of these pilgrims will be for housing, accommodation, food, and means of transport. Both the Vatican and the municipality are working around on favorable terms on which new being erected buildings suitable for future use as hotels. The Vatican specially is considering the needs of the poor pilgrims for whom large barracks-like houses will be provided, where all, however small their means, may have shelter and a reasonable amount of comfort. The population of Rome has grown from the 250,000 in 1870 to about 1,000,000 today. When Rome became the capital an excellent system of drainage was installed, but the increase of population has necessitated its enlargement, and this year alterations and improvements on a large scale are being carried out. Half of the roads of Rome have been relaid this winter and the other half are awaiting their turn to be dug up. In preparation for Jubilee Holy Year a large number of lines of trams and auto buses will have to be put together already existing, in order that pilgrims may easily visit the distant Basilicas and, as far as such nighting as is possible, in the intervals of their religious exercises.

ASTRONOMER TO MAP STARS

ANN HARBOR, Mich., (AP) — Mapping the heavens that look down upon "the Land of the Southern Cross," to complete the list of double stars that swing out to the south of this continent, is a task Dr. W. J. Hussey of the University of Michigan expects to begin within a year. With other astronomers he has listed the double stars of the north. In the time he has been in the Southern Hemisphere, he has been in the Southern Hemisphere where he has found a small number. His quarter century search for a location probably probably ended, he expects to devote seven or eight years in completing the work. He will take a 27-inch telescope. His probable location will be Naval Hill, looking down upon Bloombfontain, in the Orange Free State, although the top of some older peaks in that locality may be chosen. He found points near Bloombfontain had the advantage of great clarity of atmosphere. Visibility to the horizon edge and almost 200 cloudless nights a year. From his experience searching among the northern stars Dr. Hussey believes that the third of double stars above the ninth magnitude in those already known.
