LEGAL MEN AT HOT LAKE

Aberdeen Lawyers Have Had Eventful Careers in Legal Profession.

HOT LAKE (Special) — The courts of law of Aberdeen, Wash., are well represented this week at the Hot Lake sanatorium. Both Judge Ben Sheeks, who for 12 years has sat on the superior bench of Grays Harbor county, and Arthur Cross, now serving his thirteenth year as Aberdeen's city attorney, are patients at the eastern Oregon institution.

Judge Sheeks, who is just rounding out his eighty-third year of life, can look back on a career of unusual legal activity. Immediately following his graduation from law school, he served two terms as probate judge of Omaha, Neb. He then started west and arrived in Wyoming just in time to become a member of its first territorial legislature. He was speaker of the second house of this state which was to be the first to grant suffrage to women.

As general counsel for Brigham Young, Judge Sheeks next was called to Salt Lake City. Among the famous cases in which this position brought him were the polygamy trials. He represented Young and his people when they were taken before the United States supreme court. From Utah the judge moved to Tacoma to recover for that city nearly a million dollars as damages against a local power company. Aberdeen has been his home since the Tacoma days and it is there he will close his professional career. Judge Sheeks' term expires with the first of the year and he will not be a candidate for re-election.

Though Cross has not obtained his legal experience in as many cities, the eighteen years since he completed his collegiate work have not been idle for him. For five years he was prosecuting attorney for Grays Harbor county and this is his sixteenth year as attorney for his home city.

Protection of Livestock Object of New Association

HELENA, Mont. (AP)—Organization of the Western States Livestock Sanitary Association, looking to the prevention of the spread of disease and establishment of uniform methods in promoting the livestock industry in the west, was recently completed with the adoption of a constitution and by-laws, drafted by Dr. W. J. Butler of Helena, Mont., state veterinarian, and president of the association. The membership includes livestock sanitary officers, shippers, ranchers, and others interested in the industry in the western states.

The aims of the association, according to the constitution, are "to form a common meeting ground between the livestock shipper, grower, sanitarians, and the various agencies interested in the marketing of livestock. Information relative to the existence of dangerous communicable diseases will be disseminated when deemed necessary, as well as information relative to the prevention, control and eradication of infectious, contagious and communicable diseases."

Scientists Plans to Time Rapidity of Light Beams

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Whether light travels at exactly its estimated speed is a matter that Dr. A. A. Michelson, winner of the Nobel prize for physics in 1907, is endeavoring to determine by a series of experiments.

The computed rate is 186,000 miles a second, and scientists have used this figure in proportioning their light-year, the yard stick of the universe.

Dr. Michelson recently announced that he suspected light travels a bit faster than 186,000 miles a second or possibly a little slower. He hazarded the guess that the physicists were about 20 miles off in their reckoning, one way or the other. He said that for a month he would try, with the aid of government engineers, to time light rays flashed from Mount Wilson to Mount San Antonio, a distance of 44 miles, in southern California.

Special instruments were installed for the test. It was planned to reflect the rays back to their starting point by means of mirrors. The problem was to clock their passage over the round trip of 88 miles.
