## HERDER'S BODY FOUND

PENILETON, Ore.—A search for four days in the rough country near DeGard's camp in the John Day country, near the Grant-DeWalla county line, ended when employees of John Curran, sheepman, found the body of Carl Sandstrom, a herder.

Mr. Sandstrom had been ill several days but declared his health seemed restored and he felt able to go out with his sheep. When the herd returned to camp at night without a shepherd, search was started. The man was 45 years of age, a native of Finland, and had no known relatives. Funeral services were held.
