Says He Will Run For County Clerk... H. A. K. E. R. (Special) — H. A. K. E. R., who received 75 A. W. G. votes in the Republican primary for county clerk says he will not withdraw as reported and will run in case he is successful when lots are cast to determine who is the nominee. A. B. Combs, Jr., received 75 votes on Republican ballots, being Mr. Goddes. Mrs. Ingram, who was a candidate against Mr. Combs for the Democratic nomination and was defeated received 124 votes for the Republican nomination but having signed a pledge that she would not be the candidate of any other party in case she was defeated for the Democratic nomination she would not run, so the race will be between Mr. Combs and Mr. Goddes, in case Mr. Goddes is successful in the "drawing." In case Mr. Combs is successful he will be the candidate of both parties.
