

GOVERNMENT INSPECTOR IS JAILED

William H. Fahy, Enemy
of Robbers, Accused
of Postal Theft

—
CALLED "BRAINS"
OF BIG HAUL

Man Held in Chicago Jail
Sent Many Others to
Penitentiary on Similar
Charges.

CHICAGO. (AP)—Charged with being the "master mind" in a \$250,000 mail robbery at Roundout, Illinois, June 12, which he took a leading part in investigating, William F. Fahy, postoffice inspector, was held in Geneva jail today on \$50,000 bond. Fahy, who obtained evidence which went "Big Tim" Murphy to jail with his alleged accomplices for the \$338,000 Danbrough street station mail robbery three years ago, charged that his arrest was due to a frame up by criminal enemies and personal rivals.

According to Chief Postal Inspector Claraban of the New York district, who has been directing a constant surveillance of Fahey ever since a few days after the robbery, the famous detective has been followed to numerous "meets" with criminals with whom he is charged with conspiring.

**SCHOOL FUND
FOUND SHORT**

Certified Public Accountant Recommends Withdrawal of Farm Loans; Many Foreclosures Are Slated.

SALEM, (AP)—Largely because of apparent shrinkage of nearly a million dollars in the irredueible school fund, attributed to bad loans, Arch J. Tourtellette, certified public accountant of Portland, recommends that the state discontinue making farm loans from the funds and invest the money instead in carefully selected bonds.
