

DESERTERS ARE IMMUNE UNDER ACT

Disloyal French Rush Home After Passage of New Legislation.

PARIS (AP).—The amnesty law just passed by the chamber of deputies is expected to cause a rush to return in a general repatriation of French soldiers who had passed into history as "deserters on the field of battle."

Already, though the senate has still to pass on the measure, the soldiers are crossing the frontier and breathing the air of France for the first time in six years or more. One of them, a soldier named Robin, given up for dead after the battle of Chemin des Dames in April, 1917, started his journey in April, 1924, started his journey in Paris, by suddenly appearing before him the other day.

"You don't know me," remarked the deserter, who had grown a beard during his exile.

"No, I don't know you," was the reply.

"I am your father," replied the deserter.

"My brother was killed at the Chemin des Dames," was the rejoinder.

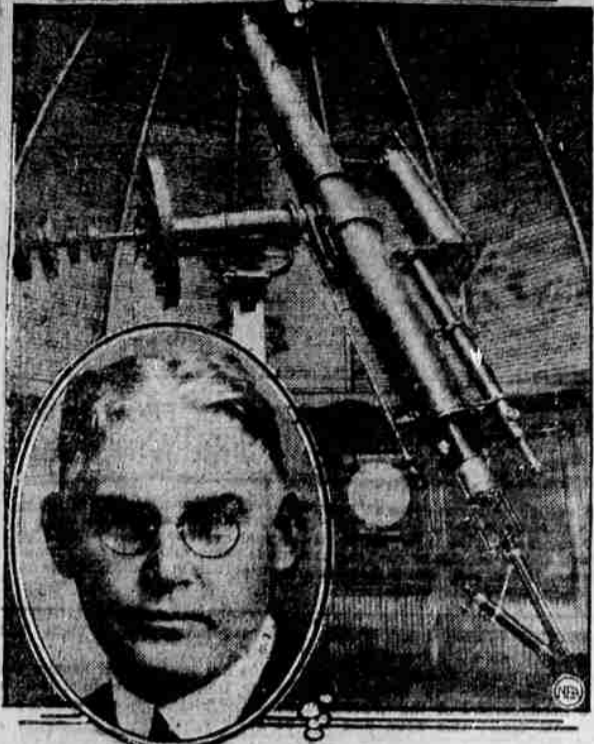
"No," insisted the deserter. "There were not so many butchered as was supposed. A lot of them deserted to the enemy and I was among them. Now that the chamber has passed the amnesty law, I have come back and I need money to start me off."

The brother agreed to give him funds on condition that he never show his face in the neighborhood again.

The deserter walked off with the money to celebrate his return at a public ball in the Boulevard de Grenelle. There he picked a quarrel and within half an hour was carried out with a fatal stab in the abdomen.

SUN'S ECLIPSE NEXT YEAR

WASHINGTON (AP).—While no total eclipses of the sun are listed for this year, one of the best opportunities for observing a total eclipse of the sun's face will be afforded the eastern part of the country early in the coming year, officials at the United States naval observatory here say.

On January 24, 1925, the sun will be in total eclipse. This will start at sunrise just beyond Lake Superior. Its path will be

on into New York state and lower New England. Eastern New York and southern New England will be the best positions for observations. Vessels in the Atlantic ocean north of Scotland will be able to see it at sunset. In the middle of the Atlantic it will be visible at noon.

Another total eclipse will take place January 11, 1925. This will start in Africa, crossing the Indian ocean and the island of Sumatra in the Dutch East Indies and the lower islands of the Philippines.

LIFE IS EASIER NOW IN ITALY

Italian Standard of Living Better Than at Any Time Before the War.

ROME (AP)—Italy eats more, drinks more, and smokes three or four times as much as before the war. In the old days each Italian disposed of an average of 29 pounds of fresh meat a year and eight of preserved meat; now the consumption is 45 and 48 respectively. The use of sugar has risen from 11 to 17 pounds a year per capita, while the consumption of coffee has nearly doubled. Where the average Italian drank 46 cups of wine a year, he now consumes 60.

There has been a heavy increase in the consumption of tobacco, as the average Italian used to spend nine lire every year on his smokes and now spends 65.

Perhaps the greatest increase of all is in means of transport. Before the war the bicycles in Italy numbered 1,200,000; now the country contains 2,500,000; motorcycles numbered 17,000; now there are 25,000; automobiles were 15,000 and now they number 54,000; public automobiles which were 1500 are now 7000; there were only 100 motor launches and now there are 1500.

There is no doubt that whatever Italy has suffered through the war, the standard of living of her people has gone up refreshingly.

SENATOR STRAYER VERY ENTHUSIASTIC OVER ROAD ON EAST EAGLE CREEK
Senator W. H. Strayer returned from the first part of the week from a recent trip to the East Eagle mountains, very enthusiastic about the new road leading into Eastern Oregon's scenic wonderland, on East Eagle creek.

The road was constructed under the supervision of the forest service, with Ves Hughes in active charge of the work. The road is from nine to twelve feet wide with a grade of four to five per cent, in contrast to the 30 per cent grade on the old road. The wide road makes the passing of cars very easy on practically any section of the road. In previous times it was necessary to shift gears of a car into low but now the ascent can easily be made in intermediate. According to Mr. Strayer the citizens of Baker have subscribed over \$1000 to the construction of this road and sportsmen in this city will be well paid for the expenditure.

Mr. Strayer met B. N. Bonney, superintendent of the fish hatchery at Union, Oregon, who was at Eagle creek stocking the East Eagle and its tributaries with Eastern brook and rainbow trout. Mr. Strayer estimated that about 75,000 fish were given their freedom in the creek at this time. The streams will be stocked again next month with the same amount. According to authorities on the subject, the fish stocked this year will be from six to nine inches long in September, 1925. Mr. Bonney was assisted in his work by Dunham Miles and M. E. Woodward, fishing men in that section. These men have also taken an interest in the new road and donated much of their time to this work.

Mr. Bonney was accompanied by his wife and also by his brother and brother's wife of Oregon City. These people were very much pleased with the scenery and also the new road leading into the beautiful country. Bird Spaulding of Baker, who accompanied Mr. Strayer will spend several days with Mr. Dunham and Mr. Woodward.

The road has been open since Sunday and already tourists are beginning to avail themselves of the opportunity of camping in the most beautiful spot in eastern Oregon. This new road will give fishermen access to miles of fish-infested waters, where their lust for this sport can be gratified. There is ample room in the camp grounds for 1000 people to pitch their tents and park their cars. Tourists passing through Baker should be informed by our local camp ground tender of the "highland paradise" and scenic wonderland, which can be reached by traveling the most excellent mountain road in the country. Nature was indeed generous to the people of this section in placing in easy driving distance mountains of such splendor and grandeur, and lakes and streams of unexcelled beauty. Let this be our motto, "See Oregon's Wonderland First!"
