## SHOW SLOGAN IS 'GOING UP'

PORTLAND, Ore. (Special to the Observer)—"Going up!" That's what the elevator man says. That's what the Pacific International Live Stock Exposition might have chosen for its slogan.

Ever since it was founded, it has been going up. Going up in numbers and excellence of exhibits. Going up in attendance, going up in importance. This year its building went up in smoke.

But that didn't stop it or delay it. A new building is going up. This new building is to follow in general the plan of the old one but it is going up bigger and better than ever.

The arena is to be larger than the old one and in better proportion. The seating capacity will be increased to 7,000, and the arrangement of boxes and seats will be improved. The horse department will be larger and better equipped. The boys' and girls' clubs are to have a department all their own. The poultry show will be larger than the old one. Other minor but important improvements have been made in the plans.

The type for the premium list is going up now, and by September 1 or thereabouts it will be in the mails. It will show some changes but more premium money than ever will be placed temptingly before the exhibitors.

The ashes were not cold before General Manager O. M. Plummer was talking with President E. A. Stuart over the long distance telephone, making arrangements for the new structure. A day had not passed before a man was figuring on the lumber for the new building. Before the week was gone work was begun on salvaging and clearing the ground. Today the financial arrangements are complete for the start and the new great building, "bigger and better than ever," is "going up." Construction has started.

The contractors have agreed to turn it over, complete by October 25. On November 1, at 9 o'clock a. m. the big new doors will swing open to the public.

It is gratifying to the men and women, young and children, who have a proprietary interest in the Pacific International Live Stock Exposition, to know of the enthusiastic and determined and practically unanimous support this great exposition is receiving from banks, merchants, hotels, business houses of every kind, the press and the public. The fire has made no real difference, perhaps an even better one. At this exposition is and how necessary its continued life is to the entire Pacific coast.

Last year the exposition had over 400,000 entries of livestock. It offered over \$50,000 in premium money. It had an attendance of 125,000 people. This year it expects to increase its entries, its premiums and its attendance. A bigger and better plan will be ready for the opening day. More and better livestock of every kind will be there. Better accommodations for the guests have been arranged and more people will visit this fourteenth annual event.

Some day a candidate will make a speech of acceptance as follows: "Yes." And then we shall all be happy.

## BAKER PLANS TRAIL RODEO

BAKER, Ore. (Special to the Observer)—The number of riders already signed up for the Legion's Oregon Trail rodeo next Sunday and Monday insures a huge success. Among the prominent riders are Fred Johnson, Tom Lawrence, John Powell, "Luce" Stout, Paul Harverson, George Mitchell, "Diamond" Joe, John Williams and "Nigger" George.

The committee was unable to secure the auditorium and will probably use the Baker theater. The times when different fighters will work out will be announced later. Ring-side seats will be placed on Saturday at the Smoke Shop, Burke & Brown, Pauline, Goodwin brothers and Wright brothers. Other seats may only be secured at the Baker theater Monday evening.

**U. S. Mapping Cheban Forest**

OKANAGAN, Wash. — G. M. Lutz and A. H. Hodgson of the department of maps and surveys of the forest service, with headquarters at Washington and Portland, respectively, and Phillip H. Dyer of Portland, in charge of water power, have gone to Winthrop to confer with Lage Wernstedt, who is making a drainage map of the unsurveyed portion of the Cheban National forest, north and west of Winthrop.

Wernstedt is making the map by using photographs taken from the highest peaks in the district. Views are being taken so that he can see all the territory to be covered. The peaks from which he takes views are accurately tied in to known locations of other peaks by means of a transit and triangulation. When completed the map will be the most accurate detail map of the district.

## TO HAVE RABBIT DRIVE

EMPHATA, Wash. —The Grant county fair will be held August 23 and 24. Many men, mostly from the Moses Lake community, are each giving several days time repairing the buildings, grounds and fences and it is expected that all will be in readiness.

A program of sports and attractions has been arranged by the committee. The sports program will begin each afternoon at 1:30 and run until 4 p. m.

At 4 o'clock each day a 502 jackrabbit drive will be held. August 23 has been designated as Wenaschee day and all sportsmen of the Wenaschee valley have been invited to take part in the rabbit drive. August 24 has been set aside as Spokane day for the rabbit drive. The drive will be supervised by Percy MacDonalda, in charge of the jackrabbit campaign in Grant county.

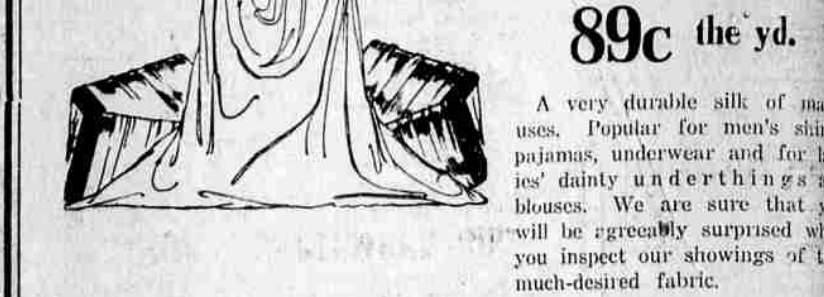
