## MAKING READY FOR FRESHMEN

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis (Special)—Freshmen week plans have been announced in detail by a special committee composed of Dr. U. G. Dubach, dean of men, Dr. Kate W. Jamison, dean of women, and E. H. Lemon, registrar. The plan adopted is distinctive, nothing like it having been used by other institutions.

Freshmen will arrive on the campus Monday, September 22, with preliminary registration on Tuesday. Prospective students in each school will be divided into groups of 15, each led by a faculty member of that school. A satisfactory examination in English will be given all freshmen. An informal assembly will "break the ice" and a reception to freshmen Tuesday evening will acquaint the new students with their instructors.

Wednesday and Thursday will be largely devoted to study of the following subjects: "College Community Relations," "Budgeting," "Student Activities," "Meeting Expenses," "How to Study," "College Regulations," "Keeping Fit," "The Value of the Expenditure," "Policy of Interest," "A 200-act party or other entertainment will be provided Thursday evening.

Actual registration of freshmen will take place Friday, September 26. Other students will register Saturday, when college will officially open for the three upper classes. This work will start Monday, September 29.

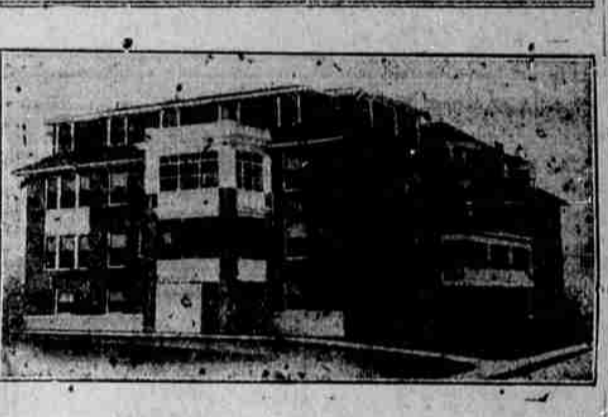
