### WILLS SAYS HE LIKES FIGHTING

Battler to Meet Luis Angel Firpo September 11 Has Taken Part in 95 Scraps.

NEW YORK (AP)—Looking back over 95 battles which led through a period of 13 years, to his most important engagement, that with Luis Angel Firpo at Boy's Thirty Acres on September 11, Harry Wills, negro heavyweight, made a simple comment:

"I like to fight." Looking forward to the five years of active ring work which he considers still remain for him regarding the outcome of the Firpo fight or a possible battle with Jack Dempsey for the goal of all pugilists, the heavyweight championship of the world he answered a query regarding his future:

"I like to fight." Of his 95 battles, Wills won 44 by knockouts and 29 by decisions. He was knocked out once, lost four times by decisions, fought two draws, 12 no-decision engagements and one exhibition, recent books show.

The only knockout he suffered in his career was administered by Sam Langford, negro heavyweight, considered by many observers as the hardest hitting man of his weight who ever fought. It came in 1916 in the 19th round. Wills more than evened the score by knocking out Langford in five rounds in 1918.

Sam McVey, Bill Tate, Tot Jackson, Kit Norton, and Jeff Clarke, all negro boxers, were also knocked over by Wills as he fought his way to challenge the white heavyweights. The first of these to take a chance, Fred Fulton, was knocked out in 1920 in one round; since that time no white man of prominence has risked his ring prestige with "The Brown Panther."

Wills and his manager, Paddy Mullins, have been consistently challenging Jack Dempsey for the heavyweight championship. The match, tentatively arranged many times, was finally lost in the brilliant fight of Firpo. It is understood, however, that the winner of the Wills-Firpo struggle will be matched with Dempsey in 1925.

Two years ago Wills was considered a real menace to white supremacy; since that time, however, he has fought only four times. The ability of his "strut" hands to stand the test of a championship bout has been doubted; his failure to knock out Bartley Madden in 15 rounds in his most recent fight, has been added food for skeptics who declare that he has "gone back."

Meanwhile Wills is carefully, methodically preparing for the moment when the first going rings, as he has conscientiously trained for each of his 95 fights. To his critics he answers:

"I am not holding my opponent cheaply and am working into my best condition. My hands are ready and I am confident. I like to fight."

### NET HONORS ARE DIVIDED

BROOKLYN MAKES (AP)—Gerald Patterson of Australia went down to a straight set defeat before Rene La Coste of France in the opening match of the final interzone competition of the Davis cup series at the Longwood cricket club turf courts here Thursday afternoon but Pat O'Hara Wood furnished a second surprise by outlasting Jean Boroff, champion of England and France, in a five set contest. As a result the score stands one match apiece for the rivals who aspire to challenge America for the International trophy in the year's concluding matches at Philadelphia next week. La Coste defeated Patterson, 6-2, 6-2, 10-8 and Wood defeated Boroff 1-6, 6-4, 1-6, 6-4, 6-2.

Friday afternoon the 20-year-old La Coste will team with Jacques Brugnot in the doubles encounter against Patterson and Wood to break the deadlock. Regardless of the outcome of the Friday match, the issue will remain in doubt until Saturday, for one of the nations must win three matches before becoming the 1924 challenger.
