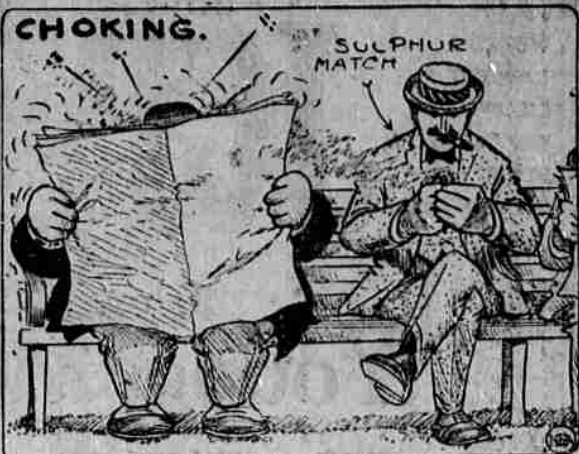

An Epic of West Is Cruze's "Covered Wagon."

A magnificent epic of the early west is James Cruze's latest Paramount production "The Covered Wagon," which will be the feature at the Arcade Theater for four days beginning today. Rumors of a S. Japan Trade Make Bonin Islanders Tidy

TOKYO, (AP)—Inhabitants of the Bonin Islands, the chain stretching southward from Japan proper, are uneasy over rumors of United States since the passage of the Japanese exclusion law by the United States congress, according to reports reaching military authorities in Tokyo.

The Bonin Islands would be Japan's first line of defense for the home islands in case of a naval war, and the islanders are uneasy about the outcome of the strained situation arising from the new immigration law. Their anxiety, it is reported, has been increased by frequent visits of inspecting to the islands by high military and naval officers which have been noted recently.

Railroad Discovers New Trick Played By Many Patrons

PASADENA, Cal. (AP)—People who have been using the Pacific Electric Railway as a medium for returning overdue books to the public library, in the future must employ other means of evading the librarian's fines.

For months the lost and found department of the railway has been returning to the library books picked up in street cars and buses. The number gradually grew until one man's time was chiefly occupied in returning books from the cars. When railway officials noticed that no one forgot to leave any privately owned books on the cars, they came to the conclusion that they were being "worked," and announced that there would be no more books returned to the public library.
