OPENING GRID CALL ISSUED

Actual work for the football prospects will begin on the field tomorrow evening after school according to an announcement by Coach Lester MacTavish today.

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FOUNTAIN PENS
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Gregg Laughs at Time



Thirteen years ago, in 1911, Van Gregg joined the Cleveland Indians and immediately established himself as a great left hander. Two years later he fanned Pittsburgh batters in a 13-inning game. This is one of the most remarkable performances on record. A few years later he drifted out of the majors and into obscurity. Now word comes from the Pacific Coast that he is staging a fine comeback and may join a big league club again at the end of the current season.

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It is customary to present a large wreath of flowers to the winning team, and it is not uncommon to see an ornate silver cup presented to the winner of a single contest. Hundreds of dollars are spent on prizes, and awards to players including all sorts of merchandise, clothing and jewelry.

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Who invented the feed-back circuit? This question is again in controversy and it is believed will eventually have to be submitted to the United States supreme court for final ruling. The United States circuit court of appeals at New York decided that Armstrong invented the circuit January 21, 1912. The United States court of appeals of the District of Columbia decided that de Forest invented the circuit in the summer of 1912. It is understood that a controlling patent will shortly be issued to de Forest, who will then take the necessary steps to have the question of title, as between himself and Armstrong, passed upon by the courts. Pending such litigation, which will probably run for several years, neither patent would be available for enforcement against infringers and licensees would probably be justified in discontinuing payment of royalties awaiting the result.

BERLIN. (AP)—The boys and young men of Germany are intensely devoted to football. Where there was one football club ten years ago, there are 15 today. The season play runs through the entire summer and well into the cold of winter.

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'DAZZY' VANCE BEATS GIANTS

"Dizzy" Vance, that all-powerful hurler, defeated the New York Nationals yesterday 7 to 2, his win throwing the Brooklyn team but one-half game behind the league leaders, Pittsburgh, in third place, was able and now trails Brooklyn by one and one-half games.

Forty thousand saw Vance pitch his team to triumph—his 12th straight win.

Leaders Victorious
But two games were played in the American League—Washington defeated Philadelphia 3 to 4 and New York shut out Boston 3 to 0. Buck, pitching for the Yankees, allowed but two hits while Kirtz smacked out his 44th homer of the season into the center field bleachers.

British Flyers Decline Honors
TOKIO. (AP)—The Japanese government's offer of decorations for Major A. Stuart MacLaren, leader of the British flight around the world, and his companions was courteously declined by the British officers on the ground that they have not completed their mission and do not deserve the honor, it is learned on good authority.

DIAMOND 'RAZZ' IS VERY RARE

TSINGTAO, Shantung, China. (AP)—The Japanese have been half with an undying affection for the diamond 'RAZZ'.

A crowd of 5,000 spectators is frequently seen to 5,000 people on the sides of the natural amphitheater in Tsingtao where the ball tossers perform.

The Japanese play the game conservatively; they dislike fast line long chances and rather will base-running. One of the fast outfielders in the Tsingtao aggregation, who formerly played the game in America, has a tendency toward risky base-stealing and consequently is kept safely on the bench where his example will not upset his mates.

As a rule the fans are intensely loyal, and they could teach American crowds a few lessons in sportsmanlike behavior. They look upon "razzing" as something that isn't done. The Japanese are considerate of the feeling of others and to "raze" a player would be unbecomable. For the most part a crowd of Japanese spectators maintains a funeral silence, but it will burst into a salvo of applause without rhyme or reason. Sometimes a player

receives a consulting wage of hand-capping after making a mess of a grounder or muffed a high fly. A long foul ball, almost fair, frequently moves the crowd to a display of sympathy.

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
