appears on the surface. But the La Follette analysis took under the surface and find cause for cheer.

"What proportion of the workers of America," they ask, "spend their vacations touring Europe?"

What percentage of the passengers aboard a great liner returning from Europe would come from the great mass of wage earners and middle-class salaried folks to whom the La Follette candidacy might be expected to appeal. Certainly not 25 per cent!

"In the main such travelers come from the groups which grow rich on the very special privileges which La Follette assails.

"If La Follette can get 82 votes from among a shipload of returning European tourists, he'll run like a house afire among the stay-at-homes."

Among the 262 second cabin travelers, less representative of big business and great wealth, Coolidge's lead was not so great and La Follette's vote actually exceeded that of Davis, the vote being: Coolidge 116, Davis 4, La Follette 48.

In the third-cabin group the La Follette-Wheeler ticket ran away from both old-line opponents, the 42 voters in this class giving 20 votes to La Follette as against 14 for Coolidge and eight for Davis.

These third-cabin travelers, the Independent boosters claim, are more nearly representative of the average of American voters. If anything, they would be less strongly independent than the average. Therefore the cheer!

### SMOKING BAD FOR THE FACE

VIENNA, (AP) — Women who are heavy smokers lose their fair complexion much more quickly than non-smoking women. In the opinion of Dr. R. Hofstadter, noted Viennese gynecologist, who has written a book entitled "The Smoking Woman."

The features of smoking women, he contends, are usually much sharper than those of non-smokers.

The more women smoke the sharper the nose and chin are outlined and the skin becomes very taut.

The lips, says Dr. Hofstadter, lose their rosy natural color and become pale, while the corners of the lips show wrinkles prematurely and there is a tendency for the lower lip of a female smoker to project further than the upper lip.

Through this gradual change the features of the smoking woman become more and more masculine, Dr. Hofstadter claims to have observed that heavy female smokers have a pronounced growth of beard.

The eye of strong female smokers undergoes a change, says Dr. Hofstadter. The lid rises and falls much more slowly. There is a tendency to stare. Some women even become cross-eyed as they smoke.

Among the women who smoke heaviest are teachers, students, female physicians, actresses, artists, and piano virtuosos.
