POLO CUP IS HELD BY U. S. SOLONS BACK IN THE LEAD

WESTBURY, N. Y. (AP)—America's intrepid riders, sweeping forward in another victorious march, galloped to their next and successive victory Tuesday over Great Britain's horsemen and clinched possession of the international challenge cup, symbol of polo supremacy between these rival nations.

Another picturesque crowd of 30,000 with the prize of Wales as the center attraction, saw the flying Yankees dash to victory by a margin of 14 to 5 but though it was decisive, the score does not reveal the gallant stubbornness with which the British, led by the redoubtable Louis Lacombe, made their last fight for the cup.

Invaders Fight Hard
The challenge, shifting the focus in a final desperate game, made a brilliant fight against heavy odds that divided the throng and made the match's such rouser and more interesting than the score indicates. Playing with big nerves fire and no mercy, the invaders encountered their rivals in the first period and held them on equal terms in three other chukkers.

Villa Indefinitely Suspended
NEW YORK (AP)—Pancolo Villa, world's three-time champion, was indefinitely suspended by the New York boxing commission when his claim of an injured shoulder as a basis for withdrawing from his fight with Frankie Genaro was not upheld by physicians.

LIQUOR IS TRANSFERRED
ASTORIA, Ore.—E. C. McFarland, collector of customs of Portland, and seven deputies arrived here with three automobiles and loaded up the 28 cases of bonded whiskey and seven cases of beer seized by the police here some weeks ago, following the arrest of Federal Prohibition Agent Marshall of Here and Thorewood Laybold, Astoria fishermen, who confessed to bringing in the liquor cargo.

Mr. McFarland said he understood the case would be brought to trial shortly and that the federal court had ordered him to take the honor to Portland.


