SINGAPORE, (AP)—The use of prepared opium in Malaya has diminished in recent years, and its eventual elimination depends on individual control, says the report of a committee appointed to inquire into the matter. an afternoon's training. MacTavish keeps the boys going on blocking, kicking, passing, tackling and signal practice, and incidentally it might be added that most of them need plenty of it.

MacTavish has about as much football material to work with this year as has turned out in uniform for several seasons, but the exception of Sherwood and Kerr, each of whom have played three seasons.

Prospects Good.

However, prospects are encouraging for a good team. Mac has plenty of big boys in this year's squad and many of them are

hard enough to stand the punishment.

Frank Cullen is being worked at center and seems to be taking to the job in a satisfying manner. Strand is also a possibility for the pivot position. Both of these boys stand six feet tall in their stocking feet and weigh something over 165.

There will be lots of competition for the guard and tackle positions. To begin with Hughes who is a hard hitter from the word go is on the ground with last year's experience to his credit. Hughes has the disadvantage of being light for a guard, weighing only 148 pounds. Ed Cind, Jack Dennis, Kramer, Moore and Smith are all likely budding prospects for the line position. All are large and powerful.
