Here balloon trousers for the men, and gay pink, blue and yellow waists, full petticoats and white caps for the women still are worn in Marken.

M. E. GROWTH IS EXCELLENT

MEDFORD, Ore. (Special)—The rapidly increasing growth of the Methodist Episcopal church of Oregon was shown here by the annual reports of the district superintendents at a session of the annual state conference of that denomination.

There are 200 pastors attending the conference, 50 wives of pastors and 30 other delegates, officers, speakers and prominent visitors.

In his statistical report Dr. Leach called attention to the fact that Wasco county had the largest apple orchard in the United States and that Umatilla county produced 1 per cent of all the wheat of the United States.

Dr. E. E. Gilbert, superintendent of the Salem district, reported that Tillamook had finished a new \$30,000 church; that \$5000 had been spent on a new church in West Salem; that \$95,000 has been paid on the new Wesley building and church at Corvallis, and that the Epworth league institute at Falls City in August had the annual number of 345 registrations.

For the southern Oregon district Dr. S. A. Danford reported that Medford had completed a new \$110,000 church; that Williamson

river had finished a new \$2000 parsonage and Brownsville a new \$7000 church. He also reported that Eugene has spent \$9000 on a new parsonage, Oakridge has a new \$3000 church, Gold Hill a \$1000 parsonage, Shedd a new \$1000 church; that a \$4000 tabernacle had been completed for the camp grounds at Cottage Grove and a new \$7000 parsonage at Marshfield.
