### U. S. GRAND JURY IN FALL SESSION HAS SIXTY CASES

PORTLAND, Ore. (Special)—Approximately 60 cases of alleged federal law violations will be considered by the federal grand jury at its fall session which opens today. Among them are several of interest to the general public, but none is regarded as of outstanding importance—rather the usual grab bag of alleged petty violations, covering such things as drunkenness, covering up, women and autos. The grand jury is scheduled to sit until October 2, but an extended session is probable, since the United States attorney's office said. Every effort will be made to expedite the trials of persons against whom indictments are returned. It is planned to institute trial proceedings as soon as an indictment is brought, not to wait a formal return when the jury concludes its work.

BERKELEY, Calif. (AP)—Miss Helen Wills, the youthful national women's tennis champion, who returned to her home here recently from a triumphant tour during which she won the Olympic championship and successfully defended her American title, had a pen and ink drawing of a tennis scene in a late issue of *Pollack*, the campus comic magazine at the University of California. Miss Wills is majoring in art at the university, where she is a sophomore.

## 'LEFTY' O'DOUL READY AGAIN

SALT LAKE CITY (NEA Special)—"Lefty" O'Doul, of the Salt Lake team, stands a good chance of going up to the majors again—and this time, take it from the western fans, he'll stick.

"Lefty" O'Doul, pitcher, didn't make much of an impression. But "Lefty" as an outfielder with a batting average of .378 for 199 games and a much feared throwing arm—had's different.

O'Doul is one of baseball's enigmas. After a good showing in the west he was taken east by Miller Huggins of the Yankees in 1920—only to warm the bench with scarcely a chance to show his stuff. Next season Huggins released O'Doul to the San Francisco Seals—and he proceeded to win 25 out of 24 games. This caused Huggins to recall him in 1922—only to leave him on the bench again.

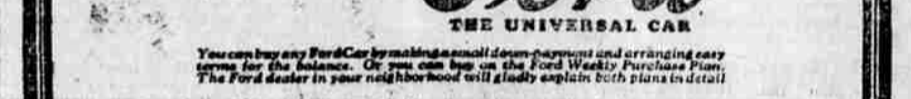
