ALL SECTIONS ON BALL SKED

Intersectional Play Will Be Big Feature of Fall Football Season.

NEW YORK, (AP)—International football will play a big part on the intercollegiate football this season. Several important games between strong teams from different sections of the country are scheduled, those games being the only available basis of comparison between the grade of football as played in the east, in the west and south of the Mason-Dixon line.

The Army leads the list with four intersectional contests on its schedule. Notre Dame needs three teams out of its territory, while Yale, Brown, Penn State and Dartmouth College each play two intersectional games.

Navy's game of Princeton is the only one of its kind. Princeton will be met on September 29, followed by a game at South Bend against Georgia Tech's Golden Tornado, games in the same formidable of all intersectional assignments.

Oregon potato growers are learning that it must produce for itself alone; that it cannot hope to ship a surplus into eastern states in a profit. Outside of the California market, exporting is a losing proposition, as the eastern and middle west states can far more than supply the demand at much less freight expense. The crop in Oregon this year is considerably less than in 1924, but this is because of a poor crop, occasioned by dry weather, rather than reduced acreage. Last year Oregon produced 1,100,000 bushels. This year the crop is estimated at 2,740,000 bushels.
