TRADE VOLUME SATISFACTORY

The lumber trade has slowed down perceptibly during September, but the volume is satisfactory to most producers, and the outlook is judged favorable. The consensus within the industry is that no great activity can be expected during the rest of the year, but that the present volume of trade will probably be maintained until weather conditions definitely interfere with outdoor work. This expectation is based on prospects for an increased farm demand during the next two months, which should outbalance the decline in city consumption already noticed. The American Lumbermen's Chicago. Present weather conditions have been favorable to the corn crop in most sections of the belt, and it is felt that it reasonably warm temperatures continuing for another three weeks, the crop will turn out considerably better than has been counted on. In this case, settlement among the agricultural population of important consuming sections would be infinitely improved and would be a powerful stimulus to the lumber trade.

The southern pine market everywhere is being supported by a strong demand for construction items from practically the entire south and the southern half of the middle West. The lumber continues to run slightly in excess of output, and the lack of stock at the mills prevents any pressure of consequence for new business. The only disturbing element is the large number of transit cars being put aside by wholesalers following speculative purchases made some time ago. Prices for mill shipment are well maintained, and no early material weakening is there to be looked for. There has lately been a number of orders for railroad and car material, but these have not helped the market appreciably, nor are many more in prospect.

The Douglas fir situation is virtually unchanged. Orders still exceed production by a fair margin, and the shortage of several popular forms is acute. Prices are being firmly maintained at their recent high levels. Some attractive car material orders have been placed during the last fortnight, and a limited volume of business of this character remains in prospect. Exports are steady at about normal, Japan buying on a fair scale, but conservatively. The California market is improving, but the Atlantic seaboard is demoralized at account of the heavy engagement of ships, which has retarded the movement of the lumber. The rail market is good and holds out promise for October and November.

Hardwood trade is well maintained, but it is evident that the market for the southern species is showing a slight weakness, due to seasonal plus political causes. Northern hardwoods, on the other hand, remain strong with lower grades showing an upward tendency as a result of a good demand for material of that description and low stocks.

Swedes Have Cut Timber For One Thousand Years

STOCKHOLM, (AP)—Sweden's work of forest conservation has managed to keep the land in the neck-to-neck race with the rapidly increasing output of industrial products, according to a government report in which the statement is made that Sweden has "an inexhaustible gold mine in her forests."

This abundance is regarded as of great importance to the nation, since about 40 per cent of its exports consist of timber, wood pulp, paper and other forest products. In 1922 these exports alone amounted to a value of about \$152,000,000, and in the 12 months ended last June, upwards of \$15,000,000 of Swedish wood pulp was shipped to paper mills in the United States.

The forests in Sweden, which have been drawn upon for commercial purposes for at least 1,000 years and by no means exhausted, now cover about 52 per cent of the total land area of the country, and extend principally at spruce and pine.
