SEASIDE, Ore. — Attracted by the run of silverside salmon, which have been ascending the Necanicum river the past week, visitors to the city have been interested in watching the seals which entered the river in quest of the salmon.

After satisfying their appetites with silversides these "dog" seals have departed themselves playfully near the Twelfth Avenue bridge by tossing porpoises and other smaller fish in the air and catching them before they hit the water.

Austin, east side orchard worker, who had asked for a ride to town, sustained bruises about the body and legs when he attempted to jump from a motor truck loaded with apples moving down a heavy east side grade, Charles Northern, driver of the machine, lost control when it slipped out of gear.

FIND DEEPEST OCEAN POINT

TOKIO, Japan. (AP)—The lowest known point on the earth's crust, the deepest known trench in the ocean, lies about 145 miles southeast of Tokio. This discovery, made recently by the Japanese naval survey ship, Manshu, has been announced by the navy authorities.

The new "deep" measures 32,656 feet, or more than six miles. It exceeds by 545 feet the hitherto greatest known ocean depth, the famous Marianas trench in which the United States naval ship Albatross in 1899 found 32,085 feet off the east coast of the island of Mindanao in the Philippines.

The Manshu's "deep" apparently lies at the bottom of a precipitous declivity descending sharply about 100 miles from the south-eastern coast of the main island of Japan. To the Japanese the first interest in the discovery lies in the scientific possibilities of this trench so near their coast. The sharpness with which the ocean bed plunges a few miles from Japan is held by scientists to be a contributing factor to the severe earthquakes which visit this part of the country.

Falls City Principal Chosen.

FALES CITY, Ore. — Lester Barnhart of the Barnhart Brothers' store here, has accepted the principalship of the local grade school, taking the place of J. B. Tyler of Hollingham, Wash., who failed to show up. A misunderstanding existed as to Mr. Tyler's having accepted the position, and when he did not appear for the opening of school last week it was evident that he did not want it. Mr. Barnhart is a teacher of several years' experience, and has served as superintendent of the schools at Falls City, Ore., for the last three years.

E. L. Mee of Seaside Indicted

ASTORIA, Ore. — The circuit court grand jury, which has been in session here for the last three weeks, was dismissed pending call by Judge Eakin after returning two indictments. E. L. Mee, formerly an employe of the Sanitary Meat Market at Seaside, was indicted for larceny by embezzlement. Specific charges were that he had made away with \$1900 in currency.

College Barn to Be Rebuilt.

SALEM, Ore. — The board of regents of Oregon agricultural college at a meeting here today authorized the expenditure of \$15,000 of college funds for the erection of a new horse barn to replace the one that burned at Corvallis a few days ago.

Mr. Moore stated that such a station would enable local fruit shippers to utilize the Spokane, Portland & Seattle in shipping strawberries and apples.
