## Hints for the Housewife

**REAL LEMON MERINGUE PIE**  
Homemade lemon meringue pie is always a real treat because the flavor is so different from that which we get in restaurants or in bakeries. Most restaurants have good apple, peach, pineapple and other fruit pies, but one seldom gets tasty lemon pie. They are frequently made with extracts and are eggless.

The filling should be prepared in an enameled ware double boiler which is impervious to acid in citrus fruits. This ware will insure the delicate color of the filling and the result will be creamy and delicious.

Beat the yolks of two eggs until light and then add two tablespoonfuls (rounded) cornstarch which has been dissolved in a little cold water. Add the grated rind and juice of one lemon and one cupful sugar. Mix all thoroughly and put into an enameled ware boiler. Lastly add one cupful boiling water and cook until it thickens, stirring all the time.

For the pastry use one and one-half cupfuls prepared flour, one-half cupful butter or other shortening and four to six tablespoonfuls of water. Roll out and cover a deep enameled ware pie plate. Prick well with a fork to prevent bubbles. Bake in a hot oven. When cool add the filling and

cover with the meringue made by beating the whites of the eggs and four tablespoonfuls granulated sugar until stiff and dry. Return to the hot oven right under the flame and watch closely with the door open until it is slightly browned.

## RATTLER FOUND IN CRIB

THE DALLES, Ore. — A full-grown rattlesnake, coiled in the blankets beside a 3-months-old baby, was discovered by Mrs. Charles Doyle, wife of a Mill creek rancher, when she sought to soothe the frantic cries of her son. In placing her hand beneath the blankets to pick up the child she felt the snake's tail. She snatched the baby from danger and called for help. The snake, escaped when the blankets were thrown outside, but was seen to be a large one, with a number of buttons.

It is presumed the reptile, in seeking a warm place for hibernating, crawled into the baby's bed. Cold weather, which made the rattler sluggish, was believed responsible for its failure to strike.

## Prisoner to Be Returned.

SALEM, Ore. — William Nelson, charged with assault and robbery in connection with the theft of \$2447 from Otto Langer of Portland, will be returned to Oregon for trial. Requisition papers authorizing Nelson's extradition from California were issued by Governor Pierce. An officer left in quest of the prisoner.

THE HAGUE (AP). — Even the hallowed precincts of Andrew Carnegie's peace palace are not safe from the depredations of souvenir hunters. It seems, for it has become known that the presidential hammer has been stolen from the council table of the permanent court of international justice. The hammer is artistically carved of ebony, about 12 inches long. It was presented to the court by the senate of Leyden university in 1922.

It has been missing since August 26, and information leading to its recovery is requested by the Hague chief of police.

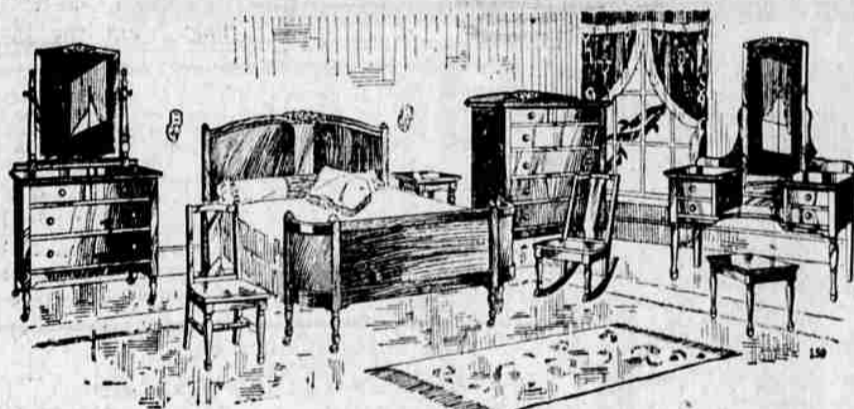

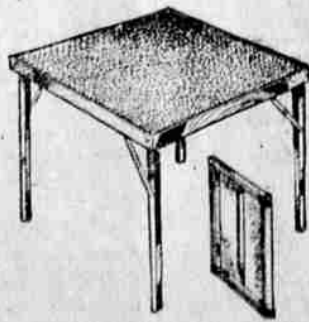
