Doughboys Gathering In Washington Today

WASHINGTON (By the Associated Press)—Comrades who fought in France under the flag of the First Division were gathering today in Washington in preparation for the divisional and regimental reunions tonight which will precede the exercises tomorrow at the unveiling of the memorial to their war dead. It was expected that 10,000 or more First Division men, of the more than 60,000 who passed over the rolls of the famous battle organization in France, would be present tomorrow to participate in the ceremonies.

A three day program will occupy the veterans with the dedication of the monument as its chief feature. President Coolidge will deliver the address of dedication and Private Dan R. Edwards who won both the Medal of Honor and the Distinguished Service Cross for repeated displays of extraordinary valor in action, will draw aside the flag that veils the memorial to his dead comrades.

The navy played host to its soldier comrades today, taking them down the Potomac to visit Mount Vernon, the veterans being served with luncheon during the river trip. On their return the various regimental and other organizations included in the division, which have established associations to perpetuate the comradeship of war days, were scheduled to meet preparatory to a divisional reunion at night.

First Troops In Battle

Seven years ago today, the First division was preparing to enter the battle line in the Lunenburg sector, the first American troops to come in actual contact with the enemy in the world war. It moved into position Oct. 23, 1917, and two days later, Battery C, 4th Light Artillery, fired the first shot in the struggle for Pershing's troops. On November 3, three men of the 15th Infantry, Henderson, Enright and Hay, were killed in a German raiding attack, the first American soldiers to give their lives, and the first German prisoner to fall into American hands was captured.

To add to the dedication ceremonies, the War Department brought to Washington from northern posts a composite regiment from the 16th and 18th Infantry which now, as during the war, compose the First Brigade, First Division. The Sixth Artillery also was brought to the capital for the ceremonies, although it was impossible to bring the entire unit.

It is a proud record of heroic devotion to the flag that is written on the memorial. From Lunenburg through all the fighting at Cantigny, Salmons, St. Mihiel, the Argonne, Sedan the First division left its dead on every field until the great roll of those to whom the living pay tribute numbered 5556 names. It numbered its total casualties in five times that number, counted the prisoners and guns and war materials it captured in the thousands, and through it all, by the written testimony of General Pershing himself, its courage never wavered, its morale never broke.

American Motion Picture Man Sees Berlin Poverty and Misery

BERLIN (AP).—"After what I have seen now at Berlin, I am convinced that the overwhelming majority of the Berlin population lives in misery and poverty," said D. W. Griffith, American film director, supervising two film productions produced here, to a German newspaper man. "I guess that any good friends who truly sympathize with misfortunate prodigally divided their worthy endeavors only between the Hotel Bristol and the Palais de Danse, while visiting here," the film man added.

2 BOYS ARE HOMELESS.—FOOD RIVER, Ore.—Partine has been taken to Little Italy and Johnny Hilton, aged respectively 3 and 2, sons of Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Hilton. The mother recently was placed in the Salem hospital for the insane, and the authorities have been unable to locate the father, a long-time camp worker. Older girls of the family have been placed with relatives, but the boys have been kept here, spending the nights in the city jail.

The district attorney ordered the boys removed to a city hotel, where they will remain until they are placed in a state institution or otherwise cared for.
