U. S. PASSPORTS LURE EUROPE'S EXPERT THIEVES

HAMBURG (AP).—American passports and foreign passports used for the United States are now worth their weight in gold in central Europe, and passport thieves are busy on trains, in hotels and on steamers and wharves.

Scores of stolen passports are reported weekly to American consular officials. It is a frequent occurrence for a foreigner who has obtained a valid document for America to have his papers stolen before he sails.

Americans are warned by consular officers to keep the numbers of their passports, and make speedy reports of theft to the nearest consular office.

Heavy-Handed Dealers Week Table Ward at Wembley

LONDON (AP).—The average daily crowd of 70,000 people at the Wembley exhibition are responsible for the smashing of 20,000 pieces of crockery every six days. In an average week the breakages are 761 dozen cups, 345 dozen saucers, 472 dozen plates and 774 dozen miscellaneous pieces, according to the firm which has the contract for feeding the visitors.

These figures do not include glasses broken in the drinking saloons, and it is stated that it is no uncommon thing in a busy week for one bar to smash 1500 glasses. As there are some 24 bars in the exhibition, it is apparent that the number of glasses

smashed since the exhibition opened in April must be about 700,000.

Reason Found Why Japan Failed in Olympic Games

TOKYO (AP).—Japanese newspaper express disappointment at the showing of the empire's athletes at the Paris Olympiad. "It was not much to boast of," says the Osaka Mainichi.

The fault is found in part, this newspaper continues, in Japanese houses, customs and food, which all together tend to produce men of lighter physique than is the rule in western countries. "Our people should live, eat, work and read according to principles which promote health and strength."

AIR ACCIDENTS CAUSE WORRY

LONDON (AP).—Since the beginning of the present year there have been 55 deaths among officers and men of the Royal Air Force directly due to accidents to machines. Considerable anxiety is occasioned by such a large number of fatalities to the personnel of the youngest arm of national defense, and the Aeronautical Research committee is urging that steps be taken immediately to lessen the losses due to lack of technical knowledge among members of the force. All of the experts declare the skill of British pilots cannot be questioned.

The Aeronautical Research committee has year-emphasized the need for a higher standard of technical knowledge in all ranks of the Royal Air Force, and particularly among squadron officers. In this year's report they note with satisfaction that the Air Council agrees with them.

"But a general raising of the standard of technical knowledge," the committee's report declares, "must take time. Meanwhile accidents which, in the view of the committee are primarily due to the absence of this knowledge, continue to occur. Many machines are destroyed, while in some cases lives are lost. The committee has felt it is he within their province to urge any steps that might reduce such losses."

Aeronautical experts are prompt to suggest, as the real remedy for

present defects, that the Royal Air Force be equipped with machines that will not stall, machines which, when they get to the stalling point, will simply glide forward and sink flat.

"To provide the remedy must mean the expenditure of money," said one observer, "but you have either to supply an elementary training machine that is foolproof or go on with the present method with its loss of life."

German Industry Ties U. S. Loan

OBERHAUSEN (AP).—The municipal savings bank, acting as a trustee, has secured a one million gold mark credit from America for the local steel industry. It is reported. For the first year of the loan 12 percent interest has been charged, while the rate for the second year will be 7 percent.

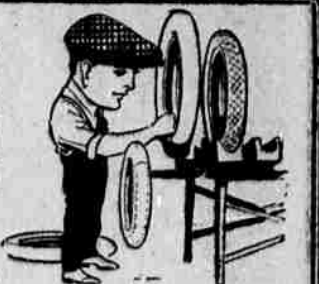
