(Special)—According to a census just taken of the student body of Whitman college, more students are members of the Presbyterian church than of any other denomination. MACDONALD'S SON DEBATER

WHITMAN COLLEGE, Walla Walla, Wash. (Special)—M. J. Macdonald, son of J. Ramsay Macdonald, the socialist prime minister of England, will debate in Walla Walla, December 8 when the team representing Oxford university will meet the Whitman college debate team. The English team consists of the three men, Mr. Macdonald, J. D. Woodruff, chairman of the team, and M. C. Hollis. The visitors arrived in this country only a few days ago on a tour of the United States during which they will meet the representatives of about thirty American colleges and universities. According to the present plans Whitman college is the only school in Washington that will meet the English team in debate.

The Oxford will propose the following question for discussion: That the extension of the interference of the state with the individual is a chief evil of the time. On this question Mr. Macdonald refuses to follow his colleagues in upholding the proposition as stated. According to an announcement made by Professor L. W. Sawcille the Whitman debaters will be chosen after a try-out which will be held during the first three days of this week. Contestants from all over the northwest have already signified their intention of entering the try-out.

Another peculiar feature of the debate will be the method of reaching the decision. There will not be the customary three judges but the decision will be rendered by a vote of the audience. According to an announcement made by Professor L. W. Sawcille the Whitman debaters will be chosen after a try-out which will be held during the first three days of this week. Contestants from all over the northwest have already signified their intention of entering the try-out.

To Sponsor Glee Club
WHITMAN COLLEGE, Walla Walla, Wash. (Special)—a mixed glee club will again be sponsored by Whitman college and placed on tour in the northwest in the early months of next year, according to an announcement made by President Penrose after a meeting of the board of deans, the governing body of the college. Howard E. Pratt, head of the Conservatory of Music will again be director of the club.

Last year for the first time in the history of the college a glee club of mixed voices was formed. The experiment was so successful that it was determined to follow the same idea again this year. While no plans have yet been formulated for the trip of the organization, it is likely that the itinerary of last year will be repeated to lead to part.

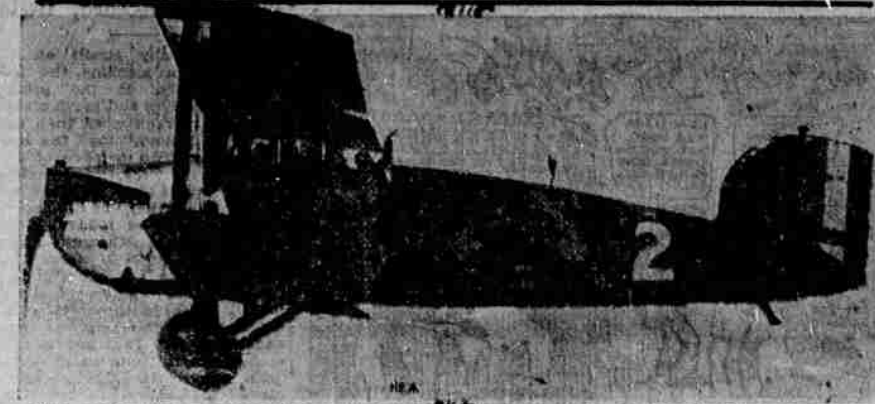

Hints for the Housewife

MAKING FALL CLEANING EASY

With the approach of cool days the average housewife begins to think of her fall housecleaning. Although she is anxious to get her winter rugs down, curtains and draperies hung, the actual work which precedes the fulfillment of her mental picture is not at all thrilling. But with proper equipment and planning it should be comparatively easy. One room can be done at a time and put in order so that the housewife is not "nosed" by disorder in every room. And, with this method, the other members of the household are not inconvenienced.

For the floors and woodwork it is advisable to have two enameled ware pails—one for scrub water and one for rinsing. And for the sashes and window casements a sponge will be found quicker and more thorough than a cloth because it works into the crevices easily. Enameled ware bowls or basins are also indispensable for the window cleaning. They can be kept on the corner of the sill without interference.

At the end of each day's cleaning period the housewife will appreciate that there is nothing so convenient to use as enameled ware. After a strenuous day this equipment is easily cleaned and it is not affected by strong soap, cleanser and disinfectant solutions.
