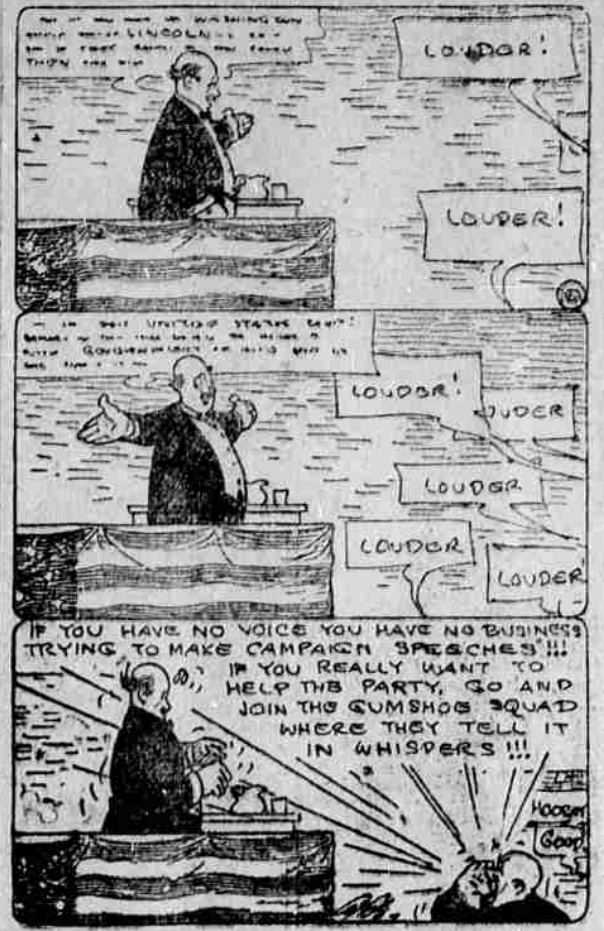

WHAT SHALL I READ?
(A few suggestions from your Public Library)

O. S. Marden, "The Conquest of War."

Fear and worry are the two most insidious enemies of the human race. In a series of stirring messages, Mr. Marden shows how they may be put to rout, with all their head-locks, indignation, envy, timidity, etc., and a man may achieve his highest aim.

John H. Mott, "Confronting Young Men with The Living Christ."

The heart of Dr. Mott's message, given during thirty years to men and boys of forty nations. Vigorous, of contagious spiritual quality, far-reaching in vision, commanding in its call to service, it offers a program of constructive significance.

Eugene O'Neill, "The Hairy Ape."

Another prize winner, 1922. One critic places this as O'Neill's masterpiece. "It is the most vigorous satire play of which I have any knowledge. Victor Hugo would have abdicated himself before it."

Dallas Lore Sharp, "The Magient Chances."
