Hints for the Housewife

BAKED RICE Mexican Style

Besides being easily prepared, rice dishes are especially nourishing and a good substitute for potatoes which, unless baked, cannot be prepared in a short time.

Rice can be cooked in twenty minutes and used at any time thereafter for several days. The following recipe for Mexican baked rice makes a very substantial "one-dish dinner" which is suitable for busy days.

Cook one and one-quarter cups of rice in boiling salted water for 20 minutes. Add one and one-half cups tomato juice, one large green pepper cut up fine, one-half cup chopped pimento and a dash of pepper. Mix together thoroughly and pour into a well-buttered enameled ware baking dish, the porcelain-like surface of which will not affect or be affected by the acid in the tomatoes. On top place the tomato pulp, left after straining the juice. Bake thirty minutes in a hot oven. Serve while hot.
