

SELLING RUSH IN PENDLETON

PENDLETON, Ore. (Special)—Another of the harvests that make the wheat market a thing of interest to both buyers and sellers occurred here Saturday afternoon when several large lots of wheat changed hands. The total movement was about 200,000 bushels, according to the estimates of dealers, and the price fluctuated considerably, according to quality, the price being from \$1.25 to \$1.40 on any "red" wheat. Some wheat was sold on a quotation of \$1.22 to \$1.34 on a No. 1 basis, but the actual selling price is said to have approximated \$1.30 the bushel.

With the heavy movement of Saturday, dealers are of the opinion that the wheat crop produced this year in Union county is between 50 and 55 per cent sold. The Chicago market closed a little higher today than Saturday, but the price was preceding at the close of the high week, having been reached shortly after its opening.

The rate at which wheat has been sold this year is unusually rapid, according to H. W. Collins, local dealer. "In the northwest we have about 10 months to go before next harvest, and our crop here is 50 per cent sold," he said. "This is an unusual condition, one that we seldom have."

EX-MAYOR ESTERS RACE

ROSEBURGH, Ore.—W. R. Hamilton, ex-mayor of Roseburg, announced himself as a candidate for that office at the coming city election. Mr. Hamilton served one term of two years before the administration conducted by Mayor Rice, the retiring official. He comes in opposition to Dr. George E. Hoek, who was announced as a candidate a few days ago.

Up to the present only five candidates are in the field for councilman, with eight to be elected. Four are ex-servicemen, Frank Stephens, Frank Lillburn, Dr. C. E. Wade and Dr. J. K. Allen. Stacey Lee, one of the present councilmen, is a candidate for re-election. City Recorder Whipple is a candidate for re-election and is opposed by H. J. Watson. W. F. Thomas is unopposed for city treasurer.

LONG BEACH FAIR HELD

ASTORIA, Ore.—A large delegation of Astoria business men participated in "Astoria day" at the cranberry fair at Long Beach. The principal feature of the fair was the exhibit of cranberries, the big product of the north beach peninsula. Varied and attractive uses of the fruit, including jellies, pies, preserves, salads, cakes, were placed on view with instructive placards calling attention to the fact that the cranberry is something besides an adjunct to the Thanksgiving or Christmas meal.

The fair products and sewing exhibits were also important features of the affair, which drew visitors from the entire lower Columbia district.

STANDING WHEAT BURNS

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore.—Fire started by the exhaust of a tractor burned more than 100 acres of standing wheat in the Tule lake region, causing a loss of more than \$20,000, with less than \$5,000 insurance. A big crew of farmers succeeded in controlling the flames which threatened to wipe out 800 or 10,000 acres of grain.

From 12 to 15 combined harvesters are rushing the Tule lake harvest, which should be completed with continued fair weather about November 1.

MOTHER, 2 BOYS INJURED

BAKER, Ore.—While parked at the side of the road on the Old Oregon Trail near Weatherby, 32 miles southeast of Baker, an automobile owned by a Mr. Hamilton of Eureka, Kan., was struck in the rear by another machine driven by Rev. C. H. Longbrake of Wisconsin.

Mrs. Hamilton, who was sitting about 20 feet in front of the car holding her baby, was severely injured and two boys who were helping Mr. Hamilton change a front tire were also injured.

Swedish Steamers To Increase Service Across the Atlantic

STOCKHOLM (AP)—Encouraged by the fact that the total gross income of the Swedish merchant marine last year rose to \$66,000,000, as against \$60,000,000 during the previous year, and that the total foreign trade of Sweden rose to a value of \$664,700,000, an increase of more than 9 per cent, a number of Swedish shipping companies have taken definite steps to start new passenger and freight services on overseas routes, especially between Sweden and ports in North and South America.

The Svea Line, which has hitherto pined its trade chiefly between Sweden and England, will start a new regular freight service to North America, and has just purchased two steam vessels in England and a 7,200-ton seagoing motorship in Sweden for the service. The Swedish South Star Line, usually known as the Johnson line, is increasing its fleet of transatlantic service, and has just ordered from the Gotaverken shipyards in Gothenburg two motorships of 7,100 tons each, equipped for combined passenger and freight service to South America. This company already has 11 direct motorships in service. The Swedish-American line, which will soon place a fourth passenger liner on the Gothenburg-Halfway-New York route, has announced that in cooperation with the Swedish-American-Mexico line and the Swedish Transatlantic Steamship company it will hereafter operate a fleet of five fast freight ships direct between New York and Helsingfors, Finland. This company has also purchased a steamer which will run between Stockholm and Finnish ports carrying passengers bound for, or coming from, the Gothenburg terminus of the overseas route.

The Swedish merchant fleet added five per cent to its tonnage last year and has since been increasing through purchases and new construction, so that at the beginning of August this year it aggregated a gross tonnage of 1,350,000. The fleet now consists of 1214 steamships, totaling 1,017,500 tons; 353 motor vessels, totaling 254,494 tons; and 727 sailing vessels, totaling 83,377 tons. The gross income of this fleet last year 1234 1234 1234 1234 1234 1234 increased 10 per cent over the previous year in spite of the fact that the average freight rates were 10 per cent lower.
