The Pacific coast conference football season will get under way in earnest this week with eight of the nine teams playing conference games. California alone will not have a conference game. It will, however, tackle the wrong Olympic club eleven of San Francisco which was defeated by Stanford 7 to 0, Saturday.

Idaho, which opened the conference season Saturday with a 41 to 12 victory over Montana, will pit Washington State at Moscow, Friday. On Saturday Oregon, free from its 20 to 0 triumph over Aggie, will line up against Stanford at Palo Alto. At the same time Washington will toe the mar against Montana at Seattle and Southern California will face the Oregon Aggies at Portland.

Gonzaga Victory Surprise. The big surprise in Saturday's games was Washington state's defeat by Gonzaga, 14 to 12. The Aggie had a tough time winning from the Multnomah club, 7 to 1, turning an almost certain defeat into a victory by scoring a touch down and goal kick in the last quarter.

Washington rolled up another large score at Whitman's expense, 55 to 6. Southern California had little difficulty defeating Arizona 23 to 0, while California exhibits unexpected strength in wallowing Pomona, 24 to 0.

In the east the big upset occurred when Cornell was set back by Williams, 14 to 7. It was the first time in three years that Bobie's team met defeat.

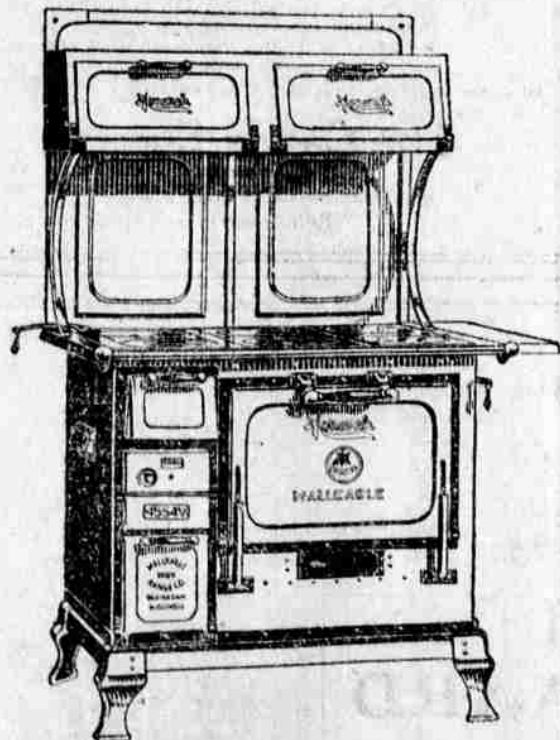
Navy Suffers Upset. The navy lost to Marquette by a surprisingly large score, 24 to 3, while the Army was drubbing Detroit, 26 to 0. Penn State, Pennsylvania, Columbia, Yale and Harvard all came through with expected victories, although Yale's win was by a one-point margin, 7 to 6. In the middle west Notre Dame easily won its game from Wabash, 24 to 6. In the big ten conference Wisconsin and Coe and Iowa and Ohio State played the games while Indiana met its first defeat of the season, losing to Louisiana 20 to 14. All other conference eleven won.
