### Caravans in Nevada Caves

Traced to Early Colonies

VIRGINIA CITY, Nev. (AP)—Wired rock writings in caves ten miles northwest of here are to be studied with a view to determining whether they are the work of Indians, as heretofore supposed, or of ancient Chinese.

Geo. Ding, Chinese student at the University of Nevada, made a visit to the caves recently and expressed belief that the writings are Chinese and depict a story of ancient Buddhist pilgrims, an attempt to circumnavigate the globe and of the landing on this continent.

It is found in China, according to Ding, that long ago, perhaps thousands of years back, five ships under command of Buddhist priests set out and never returned. Geo. Ding believes it may be possible the writings were made by these people.

### Sanitary Nursing Bottles

Unknown to Early Romans

FOLKSTONE, England (AP)—Proof that babies of the Roman expansion era were accustomed to the luxury of the nursing bottle has been found during excavating on the site of an ancient Roman city near Folkestone. The archaeologists have unearthed the nipple end of a baby's bottle made of stone, and of a shape identical with the latest in nursing bottles. The nipple also is made of stone.
