

AGED PLACED UP FOR SALE

LONDON (AP).—The changed social and economic order, which since the war has been yearly more apparent, has brought another historic mansion upon the real estate market.

This is Combe Woodhouse, in Combe Wood, once the home of Katharine Parr, a lady who achieved distinction by becoming the sixth wife of Henry VIII and undying fame when the mutations of fate decreed that she should be the ceremonial widow of a monarch, among whose spouses mortality was heavy, even for the times of the Tudors.

The interior of Combe Woodhouse is charming, all the features being Tudor. There is a leather room, also a Tudor hall, long gallery, panelling everywhere, and some old stained glass with Katharine Parr's arms on it.

Thus changes are taking place in England, the country which used to be so hostile to any interruption of the established order. Although it must not be taken as a forerunner of prohibition, it is worth noting that the Old Castle Inn at Smallbury Green, Isleworth, a favorite haunt of Dick Turpin, the highwayman, which has been good cheer since 1587, will shortly become a private residence.

The notorious highwayman, who frequented Hornsey Heath, was not the only caller whose visits are recalled by the villagers who drop into the Old Castle Inn on an evening. Shakespeare and Ben Jonson often called there on their way to Windsor and during the Victorian era its walls resounded to the conversation of such well known authors, artists and theatrical people as Dickens, Crickhank, Sir Arthur Sullivan, Sir John Barry, Sir Reeves, Marie Lloyd, and, at least once, Matthew Arnold.

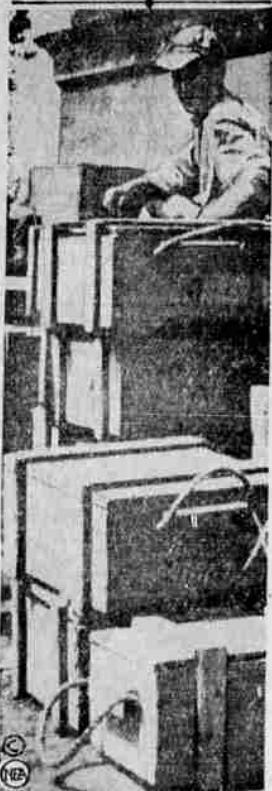

TRIBUTE PAID TO DISCOVERER

HONOLULU (AP).—Creation of a British national shrine on the shores of Kaula Island, bay, island of Hawaii, where Francis Cook, discoverer of the Hawaiian Islands who was killed by the inhabitants in a fight that occurred on his second visit, was proposed here in an address of Sir Joseph Carruthers, prominent Australian statesman who represented Australia at the recent Pan-Pacific Food Conservation conference.

Sir Joseph said that an effort would be made on behalf of the Australian Commonwealth to obtain the ownership of a right of way from the Kona road to the monument where Cook was slain, which is accessible now only by water. He added that a shrine of the spot would serve as a closer link of friendship between the United States and Great Britain and between the territory and Australia.

He said that he had obtained the land in Australia where Cook landed in 1778 and that 100,000 persons annually visit the shrine which was created there.

"My principal object in coming nearly 10,000 miles from Australia to Hawaii," he said in an address, "was to pay tribute to the memory of one of the greatest men in the world, and I feel deeply repaid in being privileged to visit the sacred spot on the shores of the bay where Cook was killed. Cook, Cook discovered Australia and opened the gates to the white race and he also discovered Hawaii."

He reviewed the life and achievements of the navigator, paying especial attention to his trials in the Pacific.

LAKE MAN'S LEG BROKEN

Slaughtered



Wholesale slaughter of cattle is going on in Texas now. It is necessary, health officials say, to prevent the spread of the hoof and mouth disease now raging in sections of the state. Steam shovels worked four days digging trenches more than a mile long in which to bury 1,000 head of cattle that had to be shot by Texas rangers in the Ellington district alone.

AMERICA TOO POPULAR WITH CHINESE PUPILS

Legation has taken cognizance of an apparently authentic report that the ministry of education has issued instructions to authorities in the provinces to cut down the quota of students to be sent to America.

"In recent years there have been too many private students going to America," the ministry in effect is alleged to have said in its communication to the provinces. "During the last 18 months the number is equal to 67 per cent of the total students going abroad."

The reason why most of the students go to America is that they easily obtain admission into American colleges where they become special students. In two or three years they return to China, being considered to have graduated.

"Although there are not a few who go to the United States to obtain a real education, a majority go simply to get a degree. Even if the standard of education in the United States is higher than in other countries, the number of students should be restricted, otherwise it may result in the setting up of a special intellectual influence in the country."
