Trade With America Chief Factor in Japan's Commerce

TOKYO. (AP)—Trade with the United States is still by far the leading factor in Japan's foreign commerce, according to figures for the entire trade for the first half of 1924, issued by the Department of Finance. The United States bought 25.5 per cent of Japan's exports during this period and sold Japan 29.4 per cent of her imports.

America leads all countries in imports sold to Japan. Imports for the six-month period totaled 1,482,000,000 yen, of which 472,000,000 yen represented purchases from the United States. India ranked second with 227,000,000 yen and Great Britain third with 171,000,000 yen.

Of the total exports, amounting to 505,000,000 yen, the United States bought 237,000,000 yen worth, China 134,000,000 yen and France 48,000,000 yen.

Free State's Finances Declared to be sound

DUBLIN. (AP)—The Free State revenue returns for the first five months of this year show reductions in both revenue and expenditures. The revenue has fallen from 14,000,000 pounds last year to 11,500,000 pounds this year, while the expenditure has fallen from 14,500,000 pounds to just over 9,500,000 pounds, most of the economy being effected in the cost of the army.

The figures are regarded as satisfactory, and the Irish Times, the paper of the monetary class, concludes that "with political stability and reduced taxation affairs of the Free State would soon become as sound as the affairs of any other country of the Free State's size in the world."
