SIX HURT WHEN TRAINS COLLIDE NEAR ASHBY

PORTLAND, Ore.—Six men were injured, three seriously, when an inbound Willamette Valley Southern passenger train collided head-on with a Portland Electric Power company's work train near Ashbury station, on the main line to Oregon City, at about 10 o'clock yesterday morning.

The injured were all employees of the two companies. They are: E. W. Force, Willamette Valley Southern, motorman, broken leg and pelvis; J. Grantquist, broken leg, cut head; Fred Wallace, Willamette Valley

RUM RUNNERS CROWD JAILS

MALONE, N. Y. (AP).—The United States government is soon to begin the erection of a large federal prison at Rouses Point on the Canadian border, according to reports circulating through police circles in the north country.

The prison will be used to house the scores of booze runners, other types of smugglers, and aliens now being arrested in Clinton, Essex, Franklin and St. Lawrence counties and confined in the county jails until their cases are disposed of.

The government is being practically forced to build a prison or detention house on the border because the sheriffs of the counties where the bulk of the arrests are being made have notified federal officials they cannot care for the scores of prisoners sent them, the county jails being full to overflowing.

Recently the situation has become much worse owing to the great number of aliens being seized in the border counties. In the county it has been disclosed that scores have been brought across the border by liquor runners and others who drop their charges as soon as the border is passed.

"Organizing is an inferior food sold only on the small and taste for lack, it lacks the vitamins necessary to the growth of children. The backers of the referendum have published statements of prominent authorities stating that it did contain vitamins but those specialists have since come out denying they made such a statement. And the Agricultural college and the Pure Dairy Products committee have conducted experiments showing that on laboratory rates that they would not survive on Margarine alone while they would on butter."

"Baker, North Powder and the Chamber of Commerce organizations of Walla Walla county have come out supporting the farmers in this work. Since being appointed to this work by the state committee I have tried to arrange for state speakers to appear before your organization and explain fully the stand of the farmer in the matter, but have been unsuccessful. The Union County Pomona Grange, representing by far the largest body of organized farmers in the county have a committee to work on this bill and the Blue Mountain Grange of La Grande has a committee who also join with me in soliciting your support."

COOLIDGE SCHEDULED TO SPEAK TWICE THIS WEEK

WASHINGTON (AP).—President Coolidge spent Sunday resting after a rather strenuous week with two more weeks filled with conferences and some speaking engagements facing him before the campaign closes.

The president and Mrs. Coolidge attended services Sunday morning at the First Congregational church. They were accompanied by Mrs. Frank W. Stearns of Boston, and Charles A. Littlefield of Lynn, Mass., White House guests.

Mr. Coolidge will remain at his desk during the closing weeks of his campaign, limiting his participation, as heretofore, to conferences with various party leaders. The president has impressed upon his recent callers the necessity for organization to get out the vote and to this end his efforts in a partial way will be directed.

Two speeches are on the program of Mr. Coolidge for this week. Thursday night he will address the eastern division of the chamber of commerce of the United States, meeting here, and Saturday he will deliver a talk by radio to the meeting of the Federated Societies of Jewish Charities in New York. Thursday night address also will be radio-cast.

DAWES TO SPEAK IN EAST

CHICAGO (AP).—During the final two weeks of the campaign, Charles G. Dawes, Republican candidate for vice president, will leave the middle west battle grounds temporarily Monday to carry his party's campaign into the east.

The Republican nominee will depart on an eastern speaking tour that will take him into Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Delaware, New Jersey and New York, a 1200 mile trip lasting a week. It will be his first stamping trip into the east as his only previous visit to that section was for a single address at Annapolis, Md., the opening of the national campaign.

A standard ration for laying hens consists of five parts—scratch, mash, green feed, mineral and drink. HINTS TO MOTORISTS
Signals, when properly made, have proved quite an advantage to everyone using the highways and streets, either driving or walking. I believe that it is safe to say that most of the violators in this case are the drivers of closed cars and it is distressing to see the number of nice shiny fenders that are scratched on account of someone failing to lower their window and give the proper signal. When the signals required by this section are given by the use of the hand and arm, they should be given as follows:

- (a). An operator intending to turn to the left shall extend his arm in a horizontal position, for a reasonable length of time, and slow down.
- (b). An operator intending to turn his vehicle to the right shall extend his arm with the forearm raised at right angles, for a reasonable length of time, and slow down.
- (c). An operator intending to stop his vehicle shall extend his arm and move it up and down in a vertical direction, for a reasonable length of time.—ALONZO DUNN, La Grande traffic officer.
