Gangloff Park

When Gangloff park was presented to the public yesterday there was a lot to think about. Pioneer days were vividly recalled by Dunham Wright and other speakers who spoke from experience in those early days.

Officials who built the highways spoke from their viewpoint, city officers paid proper tribute to the occasion. Mrs. J. E. Foley, direct donor of the ground, was present and gracefully directed the portion of the service in which she and her family were concerned. Mrs. Julius Roesch, sister of Mrs. Foley, assisted in a proper manner in the services. But there was one person on the speakers' stand whose step is no longer firm, whose hair is whitened with years of this life—a person who pioneered La Grande, who with her husband acquired the land west of the city which now contains the park—that person was Mrs. Gangloff, mother of Mrs. Foley and Mrs. Roesch.

As we sat on the hillside yesterday afternoon listening to the excellent dedicatory service and enjoying the balmy October sun, we thought of the years and years through which Mrs. Gangloff has lived. We thought of the La Grande she first knew and the La Grande of today—of the hard work and economic habits that were necessary for the Gangloffs to acquire their holdings in the early days, and of the constancy and carefulness necessary for them to retain these holdings after once having been acquired.

And then the thought came to us of the satisfaction Grandmother Gangloff experiences to see land for the park bearing her name dedicated to the public for public purposes. After all, this life is but a series of events coming in rotation, the last of which completes the circle and we are ready to quit it and step aside for the younger generations. But in stepping aside it is noteworthy to be able to bless a community, not with the intrinsic value of a park, not with a demonstration of giving, but with a lesson of thrift—that thrift which was possessed by the Gangloffs, enabling them to acquire and retain property, some of which in the evening of the life of the only survivor of the name was to be returned to the general public in a spirit of generosity and public good.

Grandmother Gangloff is a strong character. Her work has been well done, and while she no doubt has many years of life yet to enjoy, her active duties have been laid aside and she will close her career in the full enjoyment of her children and grandchildren, together with the blessing of all who will enjoy the Gangloff park.

Announcement by the Grande Ronde hospital that it will re-establish its training school for nurses will be met with general approval, for there is a permanent need of nurse training and the only way to keep up the supply of efficient nurses is for hospitals such as the Grande Ronde to maintain proper training for young ladies who see fit to choose nursing as a profession. The splendid nurses that have been trained here in the past offer positive proof of what can be and has been done along this line. It will be remembered during the war nurses from the Grande Ronde made good in every way.

Myers, constituting a majority on the land board, inaugurated a system of employing field agents to investigate and report upon the condition of the property for loan funds. The power to appoint these field agents was carefully retained by the board with its majority favorable to Mr. Myers and the plan of action, and has delegated to the secretary of the land board, under whom they would be merely expected to work.

His Exhibit.

The first of these field agents' reports were incorporated into the Tourtellotte report, but the bias in them was so evident as to bring a realization to the governor and the Oregon Journal that something less conspicuously political must be devised. This brought about the appointment of the so-called non-partisan boards of three appraisers in each county, the impartiality of which are guaranteed by the fact that they are hired and appointed by the governor.

Editor's Note.—The foregoing is the first of a series of articles in which the Tourtellotte report and the political uses to which it is being put by Governor Pierce, the Oregon Journal and others interested in the election of Jefferson Myers as state treasurer will be analyzed in detail.
