The missionaries arrive Friday and will have a work-out in the afternoon. Although weighing less than the Oregon team, the visitors have lots of fight and experience. Freshmen are permitted to play at Whitman, a fact that gives Coach Horlicke some excellent material. He finds it difficult at times to season these green men and fit them into the varsity machine, but he always has a team that does credit to the Walla Walla institution. Whitman has played two coast conference teams this season, losing by big scores to the University of Washington and O. A. C. Football fans generally concede an Oregon victory by what ought to be a comfortable lead. The interest in the game centers principally on the show Muddock's men will make. They played excellently against Stanford. The Oregon team is showing the result of the steady drill in fundamentals, and each day sees a speedier and more dangerous eleven. The backfield has lots of power. Jones, Anderson, Vitus and Terjesen are hard-hitting players.

LANDIS REFUSED TO TALK ABOUT SLANDER SUIT

CHICAGO (AP)—Kenawy Mountain Landis, baseball commissioner, refused Tuesday night to comment on the threatened suit for slander which Cozy Dolan, expelled New York coach, plans to bring against Landis and organized baseball. The commissioner also refused to reveal what course he would pursue providing the suit is filed. "It looks like a repetition of 1921," was the comment of President Johnson of the American League. "Dolan," Johnson said, "has retained Attorney Fallon. He is a lawyer who represented Arnold Rothstein after the 1917 world's series scandal between the White Sox and the Cincinnati club. He also represented Abe Attel during the time in which we tried to extradite the man who was said to be the go-between in fixing the White Sox players. Fallon has been close to John McGraw. It all seems to work out in a cycle."
