Here is a Mystery

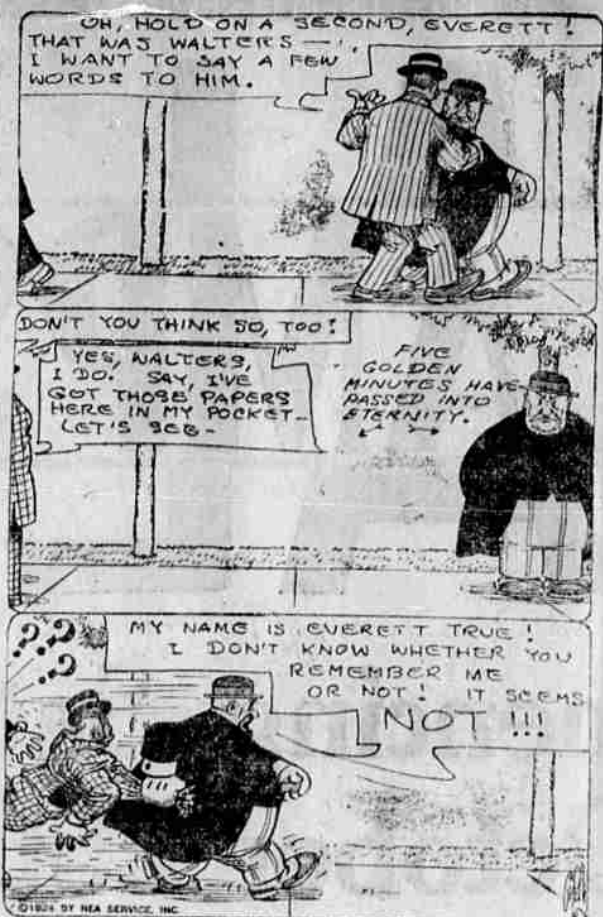

England Bank's Gold Moved to New Quarters

LONDON (AP).—After functioning in the heart of London's "rich or square miles" for 220 years, the Bank of England will cease to exist as the "old Lady of Threadneedle street" on its present site at the end of this year. While not exactly undergoing a rejuvenating process, this national financial institution will be entirely rebuilt to meet modern needs. In the meantime the bank's financial operations, connected with the nation's discounting of bills, turning the government and dealing with millions of interest payments on war loans and treasury bills, will be handled in a comparatively new block of buildings about quarter of a mile away in Pinney's Square. Here will be the home of the "old Lady" for about 120 years.

Strong rooms are being constructed in the new premises for the valuable private and government securities, which, total around 125,000,000 pounds sterling, and for the reception of 125,000,000 pounds worth of gold bars and gold held as reserve against notes issued. Some of these valuable securities have already been deposited in the new quarters, but the full move later in home drawn forth.

During the moving process no strangers are allowed to stand in handling the hundreds of tons of treasure, the whole work being carried out by the bank's special staff.

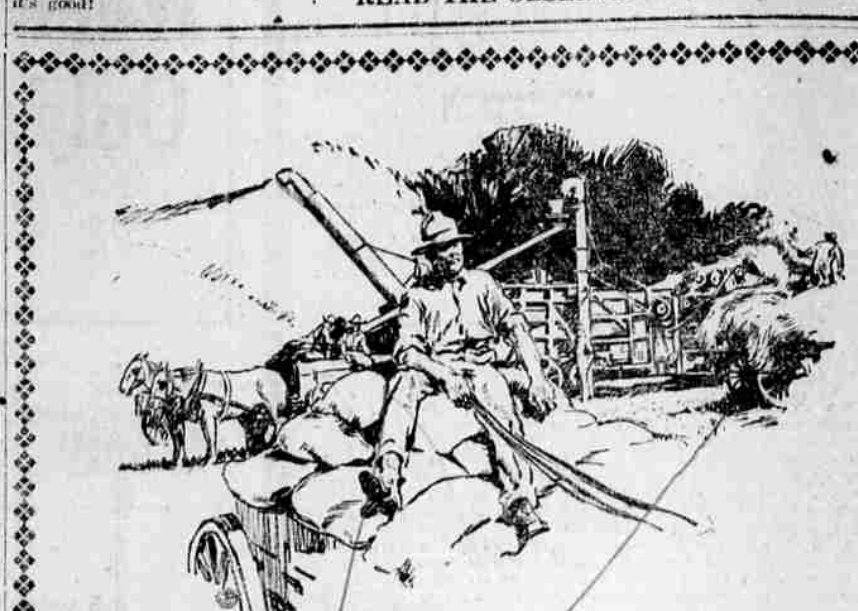
