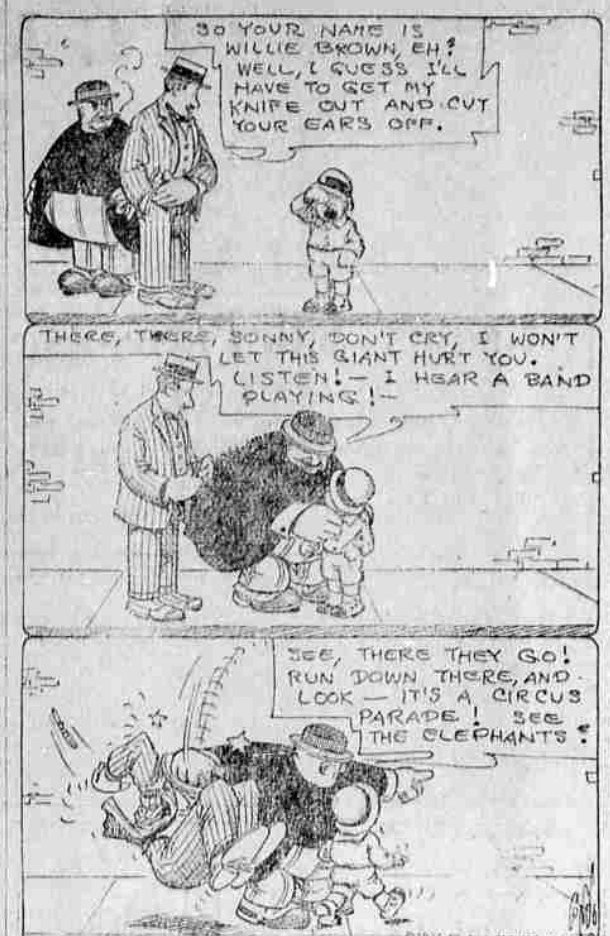

## Hunt's Daily Letter

WASHINGTON. (NEA Special) — Does it help a candidate for public office to be indicted and convicted as a law-breaker? Probably not, normally. But there are exceptions, apparently, depending on the law broken and the attitude of the voters in a given locality with respect to that law.

Take the case of John Wesley Langley of Pikeville, Ky. Langley has served 13 years in Congress from the Tenth Kentucky district—one of the few members in "Old Kentucky" which sends republican representatives to Washington. By dint of diligent campaigning and his long record of service he has been elected to reelection in his last several campaigns by majorities of 2,500 to 5,000 votes.

Then last spring a federal grand jury sitting in another state returned an indictment charging Langley with having been a party to obtaining fraudulently withdrawn permits on which a large amount of liquor was taken from government warehouses for distribution through the bootlegging trade.

He was tried, convicted and sentenced to prison, but appealed the case and is now out on bond pending a rehearing.

In the meantime he has run for re-election, and got it, and is now winding up his campaign for re-election.

And instead of his re-election by a vast majority, or even by his normal head of a few thousand, reports reaching republican congressional headquarters are that he will carry the district this year.

at least 10,000 or 12,000.

Anti-prohibitionists are watching the results in Langley's race in the expectation of making capital out of it if it measures up to present forecasts. Such a result, they will claim, would indicate popular opposition to the prohibition system.

Prohibitionists, on the other hand, will insist that a wet vote in Kentucky is only to be expected, and doesn't signify anything as to national sentiment.

Langley and his friends will hold that it doesn't mean anything either way as to prohibition, but will be a vote of confidence and trust in him by the constituents of his district who know him best.

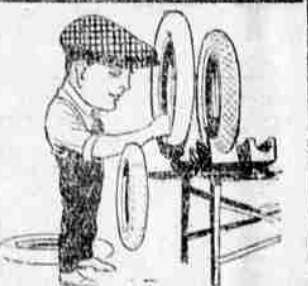
