### CITY BUDGET IS ADOPTED

SALEM, Ore.—Committee of the city council and the taxpayers held a session here and adopted the municipal budget for the year 1925. The budget aggregates \$252,315.35, or 52 cents less than the maximum permitted under the 6 per cent limitation law.

The fire department estimate was reduced \$1150, which will necessitate the elimination of one fireman. Approximately \$200 was added to the park fund to provide children's playground apparatus, and \$150 to the city lighting department.

The salary of the city treasurer was increased \$10 a month while the \$3000 of 1924. The director and supervisor of assessment notices were combined, under the direction of the police department.
