Columbia to Finish Gridiron Schedule

NEW YORK (AP).—Columbia will close her gridiron ranks and carry on the 1924 football campaign in spite of the stunning and unexpected blow sustained by the death of the head coach, Percy D. Haughton.

This was decided Tuesday by university athletic authorities who announced that the game at Ithaca next Saturday with Cornell, as well as those with New York university, Army and Syracuse would be played as scheduled.

At the same time Dr. Paul C. Whitington, former Harvard pitcher of, and first assistant at Columbia to Haughton, was appointed head coach for the rest of the season.

The entire university Tuesday was plunged into mourning by the loss of Haughton just as it seemed that the Blue and White, reaching heights it has not known for years by crushing Williams last Saturday, was about to head Columbia out of the gridiron wilderness.

First indications were that the remainder of the football program would be cancelled but after consulting Mrs. Haughton, associate of the late head coach and player, it was decided to complete the season.

While thousands of messages of condolence reached the university Tuesday plans were made for fitting memorial tribute to the man who transplanted the famous "Harvard system" to Morning-side Heights. A memorial mass meeting will be held Wednesday noon under student auspices.

Haughton's body was sent to Boston Tuesday night and arrangements have been made for funeral services in St. Paul's chapel, Boston, on Thursday.

"This process is so slow that if the motorist notices it at all he attributes it to carbon, poor oil or some other improper reason. But the operation is actually about the same as driving with a partially deflated tire or too rich a mixture.

"The installation of a new set of spark plugs at the outset of cold weather actually will prove a revelation to automobile owners. The difference in engine operation is so marked as to be unmistakable. Starting is much easier. Power and pick-up are better. There is more speed. Engine operation is improved in every way. And the owner actually saves the cost of the new spark plugs in oil and gasoline alone."

DOLAN'S ATTORNEYS TO ASK FOR \$100,000 DAMAGES

NEW YORK (AP).—Coxy Dolan, former coach of the New York Giants, has filed for alleged conspiracy in an attempted bribery deal with Jimmy O'Connell, will seek damages of not less than \$100,000 in the suit he files to be against Baseball Commissioner Landis, according to W. J. Fallon, Dolan's attorney.

Papers in the suit, which also will name President Johnson and Candler of the American and National leagues as defendants, will be filed in federal court here not later than Friday of this week, Fallon said. The action accuses Dolan of conspiracy with O'Connell to bribe Landis to grant Dolan's restoration in good standing and his share of the world series money.
