Jack Holt in "Empty Hands" At Star Today.

It would be impossible to choose a theme containing more of the element of suspense than "Empty Hands" Paramount's latest cinema thriller which opened at the Star theatre last night for a three day run. The story of a man and a woman lost in the woods, battling for survival and for the retention of their own self-respect, grips the interest of the audience right from the start and holds it through to the finish. 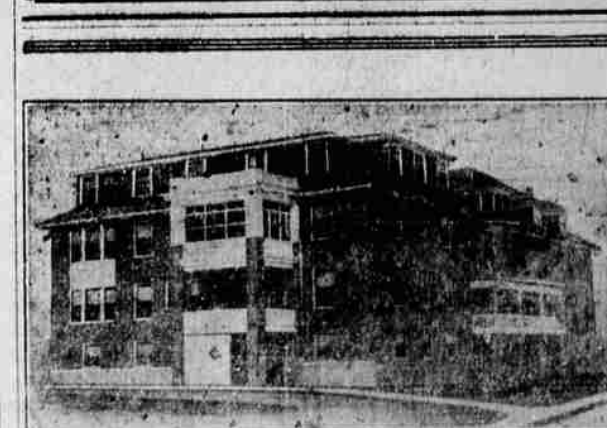
