

JAMES HARVEY GRAHAM CONFIDENT OF ELECTION

AFTER A CAREFUL COMPUTATION OF REGISTRATION FIGURES, DEMOCRATIC CANDIDATE FOR REPRESENTATIVE IN CONGRESS, SECOND DISTRICT, ESTIMATES PLURALITY OF 6400 VOTES.

I was born and reared in the city of Paola, forty miles south of Kansas City, Missouri, both parents were strict members of the Presbyterian church. I am a farmer, thirty-second degree Mason, Elk, K. of P., W. O. W., and joined the Odd Fellows here many years ago. Educated in the public school, read the full course of law with a view of taking it up as a profession, and was recommended for admission to the bar before I was 21 years of age. Have resided in Baker, Oregon, 25 years, and have been the Democratic candidate for congress six times and still running, and confidently expect to be elected at the general election. I am a Democrat, but an American first in all things. Let us obliterate party lines where America stands in the breach. No man can blindly follow his party, his president and honestly represent all the people. I believe in honest, clean, efficient, economical government repeal section 15-A of Transportation Act of 1920, which ties the Interstate Commerce Commission's hands so it can not reduce railroad rates, a constitutional amendment prohibiting excessive profits tax, prohibition enforcement and recall of wet diplomats, restriction of immigration, registration of aliens and Americanization, a Secretary of Education in the presidential cabinet, Sterling-Reed bill, separation of church and state, irrigation, drainage and reclamation where practical and feasible and where colonization will follow, government ownership of our merchant marine as a commercial asset and naval adjunct; I am opposed to the sale of three billion dollars of the people's ships for practically nothing to private investors, who would then ask for a subsidy to operate them.

I am opposed to the sale of Massachusetts to Henry Ford for a five billion dollar sum, which cost our taxpayers \$125,000,000. The nitrate works and power plants should be completed, retained and operated by a government commission, always available for national defense, to provide cheap fertilizer for the farmers and light and power for factories and municipalities. The farmer's distress should be relieved by reducing the tariff downward, by rural sanitation, public warehouses, lower freight rates, impartial expert grain grading, co-operative marketing and negotiable warehouse receipts.

I favor a national primary law for the nomination of candidates for the office of president and vice-president, thus eliminating national conventions; such a law would give the people control of national politics. The law should also be so changed that the members of congress elected in November shall take their seats in December the same year. Such a law would preclude the possibility of members of congress who had been repudiated by their constituents voting for party legislation to obtain appointment to office. The industrial monopolies and the railroads are taking billions of dollars away from the American people because of favoritism in legislation. My record is clean and above reproach.
