There is probably no subject in auction that is more interesting or difficult than that of inferences. Each bid that is made and each card that is played should carry with it some information that will often afford valuable aid in bidding and play of the hand...

Hearts—J, 10, 9, 8, 5, 5 Clubs—6 Diamonds—A, K, 9, 4 Spades—8, 6, 2
