DOMINION OF WORLD MOVED

Ever since the world war, thinking people have wondered why such a catastrophe visited the earth. It was thought that war was fast becoming an impossible thing. But the rumbling of cannon and the tread of the soldier were clearly heard by those who had their ears to the ground. A few statesmen knew that war was inevitable; for there were great efforts at preparation made by some of the leading governments of earth. God established a kingdom in Israel; but because of the wickedness of her kings it was overthrown "until he comes whose right it is," another reference to Jesus. Herber to give a free lecture at Eagles Hall, Tuesday, Nov. 4, on "World Dominion Being Transferred," in which the prophecies will be presented which describe the orderly transfer of the "kingdoms of this world" from Satan to the eternal rulership of Christ. The lecture will be given at 7:45 o'clock, and is said to be quite edifying and satisfactory in explaining the causes underlying the present world distress.

WEALTH TALKS PANIC CHARGE LA FOLLETTE

Big Business Held Behind Rumor of Hard Times If Independents Win.

LA FOLLETTE SPECIAL.—As he traveled eastward today from Grand Rapids, Mich., where he spoke last night to Synagogue No. 1, where he is scheduled to deliver an address tonight Senator Robert M. La Follette, independent presidential candidate declared in a statement that "it is being whispered about by bankers, railroad operators, industrial trusts and the press controlled by them, that should La Follette be elected there will be a panic, that credit will be shortened, and that banks will withdraw their support to business."

"This is the same old bluff that has been used at this stage of every campaign in which there has been a real issue," he continued.

Panic is Threat.
"In 1912 when Woodrow Wilson was a candidate the financiers and trust magnates threatened that if he was elected there would be a panic. He was elected and there was no panic. They have used it in state elections. They have even used it in city elections. It is a sure sign of reactionary distress. I do not question the power of Wall Street to produce a panic, but I do challenge their courage to put through the conspiracy which they proclaim with the penitentiary staring them in the face."

"Panics have been brought on by the banks. The banks have it in their power to control the way men should vote as well."

"I intend to meet treason, bribery and terrorism as any other crime against the state should be met."

"If I am elected as I fully expect to be and this wicked thing is done or attempted to be done, the department of justice with all of its agencies of investigation will be instructed to bring their crime against a free people face to face with summary justice. The punishment shall be swift and sure."

Money Holds Aces.
"The department of justice will be instructed to indict and bring to trial any man, no matter how powerful, who has been guilty of an attempt to use his power over the money and credit resources of America, not only to wreck business, but to influence votes by intimidation or bribery in any form."

"I will go further than that. Banking is a quasi-public business. It is under government supervision. Our credit resources are assumed to be agencies of regulation rather than of plunder. They are supervised by a governmental agency, the federal reserve board. I shall instruct that board to consider any such action by any member bank to be a criminal betrayal of its relations to the government. I shall instruct it to treat any such bank as an enemy of the people and as such an enemy to be unworthy of participation in the favors which the federal reserve system has in its power to grant."

Freedom is Free.
"I will go further than that. There are hundreds of millions of public moneys in the treasury."
