CHICAGO, Oct. 29.—Employed women get an average of six hours of sleep a night, according to a summary of results of a "Busy Woman's Clock" questionnaire sent out to several thousand women by Mrs. Laura P. Miller, director of the department of women in industry of the national W. C. T. U.
"The woman who does not stretch out for 'official' workday with from two to six hours of homework, seems to be rare," said Mrs. Miller. "The majority of employed women also cook at least one meal a day."
