Inquire Shows Germans Do Not Generally Observe 8-hour Day

HANOVER (AP)—The eight-hour day, while theoretically sanctioned by the new German constitution, is by no means generally observed among factory workers according to an investigation just conducted by the Factory Workers' union. Of the 451 localities of the union, 329 turned in reports covering 426 concerns employing 431,449 persons.

The results show that only 54 per cent of the employees in the concerns investigated work up to 48 hours per week, while 44 per cent work from 48 to 51 hours, 26 per cent from 51 to 54 hours and 12 per cent over 54 hours per week.
